Light Shining in the Darkness

I took my 'A' Levels in 1984. Such was the imagination of the London University 'A' Level Exam Board that one of the set texts for my English Literature exam was George Orwell's classic *Nineteen Eighty Four*. I didn't like the book then, and have never felt the need to re-read it since, but what I remember is a depiction of the world inhabited by the main character, Winston Smith, as a grey world afflicted by war, civil conflict and revolution. A world where living standards for the many were poor, people lived under



surveillance and spent a great deal of their time underground, rarely seeing the daylight. Even today, in a society which is divided by so many things; a society used to being surveyed by ever-present CCTV cameras on our streets and by the scanners at the supermarket check-out; a culture in which people spend more and more time in front of screens and communicating by short messages by text of one kind or another rather than getting outside and meeting face to face, Orwell's vision remains a nightmare. Human beings are not designed to live without daylight. We know more now than ever before that being outdoors, and seeing trees and grass is essential for our physical and mental well-being.

That is not surprising. We were created by God whose light of love shone into the darkness at creation and whose light of love continues to shine in what can sometimes seem a dark world. The need to live in the light rather than the darkness is a basic need for those created in the image of the God of light.

At this darkest time of the year, we celebrate the coming of the light of the world. The arrival of Emmanuel, born into the darkness of a Bethlehem night so that the whole world could see that the light shines in the darkness and that darkness can never overcome it. As we come to worship at the manger again this Christmas, we need to remind ourselves again that we are not designed to live in the darkness. We were created to live in the light of God's love. A love which shines out afresh in a dark world. The light shines in the darkness. Why ever would we want to live in the darkness? Yours in the light of Emmanuel,

THE CHURCH OF ENGLAND IS LOOKING TO APPOINT THE NEXT BISHOP OF CHESTER

WHAT HAS HAPPENED SO FAR?

Through August and September, the diocese ran a consultation which asked respondents to share their views on who the next Bishop of Chester should be and what qualities he or she should have. We're pleased to report that 430 individuals, groups and PCC's responded to the consultation. Following the consultation, a drafting group read all of the responses and began the process of producing the diocesan Statement of Needs - a brief description of the diocese and statement setting out the desired profile of the next bishop.

nominate someone to the role - as to the qualities the diocese hopes to see in the next Bishop of Chester. The Statement of Needs will be published on the diocesan website in November. Because diocesan bishops have a variety of roles, not only within the Church of England but also in the local community and the nation at large, the choice of the next Bishop of Chester is not made by representatives of the diocese alone.

The document will help inform the Crown Nominations Commission - the body that will ultimately

On 24 September, six diocesan representatives were elected to work with representatives of the Church of England as a whole, under the presidency of the Archbishops, to form the Crown Nominations Commission (CNC).

ST. OSWALD'S CHURCH MEMORABILIA EXHIBITION 19/20TH OCTOBER 2019

A total of £550 was raised at the exhibition. After expenses and some gifts of appreciation a total of £350 was split between the four churches of the benefice and Nantwich Riding for the Disabled Association. A further £250 in cheques was handed to me before and after the event specifically for the Nantwich Riding for the Disabled - RDA. These were donated by Worleston Parish Council and two other individual donors.

Held in the beautiful church of St. Oswald's Worleston the exhibition was an outstanding success. Fascinating displays of artefacts included 1920's beaded dresses, fans and feathers, farming corner with calf, cockerel, milk churn, and shepherd, WW1 trench art, WW2 Tilley lamp, Nantwich Battle items, Cavaliers and Puritans, Roman coins found in Poole, 19th and early 20th century photos of local people, plough and horses and a film of the Swinging 60's. I have received wonderful feedback and praise on the convivial atmosphere, the stunning church, Geoff's piano playing of Ivor Novello and the welcome refreshments and glass of wine.

It would be impossible to name everyone who contributed with artefacts and help - around 30 people in all, but prominent among them were Dianne Darlington with her refreshments, Deana Emerton's energy and innovation, Chris Pope's wonderful film show, Harry and Trena Dutton's valued support from day one, Bunbury British Legion and the enthusiasm from church wardens Stephan Davies, John Headon and David Barrett.

The initial challenge was somewhat daunting, but the rewards were great. I think for me the most significant

moment was when a young mother with her two year old little boy came and asked if he was too young to attend the RDA. I assured her he was not and would be welcome - this child was completely blind.

RECIPE

Ash House Beer Braised Brisket

Ingredients

Ash House Brisket
3 teaspoons vegetable oil
Salt and pepper
1 large Onion, thickly sliced
2 cloves of minced Garlic
2 cans Guinness beer
Fresh rosemary and thyme

Method

- In large pan, heat the vegetable oil.
- Season beef with salt and pepper and sear in pan on all sides, then transfer to plate.
- Add the onion and minced garlic to the pan and cook for 3 minutes.
- Transfer the onion and garlic to a large pot with 2 cans Guinness and 250ml water.
- Throw in a few sprigs each of rosemary and thyme, salt and pepper to taste and bring to the boil.
- Lower the heat and return beef to pot, cover and simmer on low for 2 to 3 hours.
- Serve with Jacket potatoes, or a crusty loaf and enjoy.
