Dear Friends

"A small, round thing"

I am writing a couple of days after Storm Ciara tore across Britain wreaking havoc in her wake. Once again, we are faced with the question "What is happening to our weather? Is this what climate change looks like?"

I have also just finished watching a BBC4 documentary about the writings of Mother Julian of Norwich; a remarkable 14th Century woman, who



committed her life to God following a remarkable recovery from illness. A woman very much of her time, it appears Julian learned to read and write in order to record the extraordinary visions she received from God.

One of the visions recorded by Julian tells how she saw a small, round thing, no bigger than a hazelnut, in the palm of her hand. Marvelling at its smallness, Julian wondered that it could last. Because in its littleness it seemed it would suddenly fall into nothing. Asking God for understanding of the vision, Julian came to see that this small, round thing was the world, and that it lasts, and always will, because God loves it. Concern about the environment and climate change is no-longer restricted to scientists and 'alternative people' at the edge of our society. Increasingly, recognising both the way in which we have treated the planet, and the ways in which we can change that are becoming mainstream. Finally, we are recognising that the wonderful planet we are privileged to call 'home' is fragile. It is relatively small; a mere speck in the estimated 170 billion galaxies in the universe. A mere dot in the 2,500 solar systems so far discovered in our galaxy.

Recorded around 650 years ago, Mother Julian's vision is as fresh and significant now as it was when she first wrote it. Perhaps even more so, as we too marvel that the smallness of our world and wonder whether it can survive the damage we have inflicted on it.

Yet scientists assure us that it is not too late. If we can learn to respect our planet, making changes, however small, which respect the world rather than plunder it, there is hope. Perhaps more importantly, there is hope in Julian's writing and in the record of creation in the biblical book of Genesis.

In her vision, Julian discovered 3 things. First that God created the world, second that God loves it, and third that God preserves it. It is in the discovery that God preserves the world, that the bible calls us to participate; playing our part in ensuring the world continues to remind us of all God has created and of God's love for us and all of his creation.



Plants and Flowers in the Christian Faith

Sacred Plants; Daffodils and Leeks For St.David.

St.David's Church at Wettenhall celebrates and commemorates the Patron Saint of Wales. His patronal day is the first of the year for British saints, celebrated on March 1st.

St.David has two, very different, plant symbols – the daffodil and the leek.David was born about 500 A.D. in Caefai, Pembrokeshire to a Prince Sant of Cardigan and St.Non, the daughter of a Welsh chieftan. He studied under St.Paulinus in Cardigan and embarked on pilgrimages throughout Wales, Cornwall, Britanny, Ireland and Jerusalem, where he became an archbishop. He spread the word of Christianity, founding twelve monasteries, where monks lived on bread,vegetables, water and milk. Despite the limited diet they undertook all the hard labour themselves, such as ploughing without using animals. David became the Bishop of Mynyw [now St.David's]and died there on 1st March 589 AD. He was canonised by the Holy Roman Empire in 1123, at the height of the Welsh resistance to the Normans.

The leek was the first plant symbol of St.David.Two different both of triumphant battles, are said to be the origins of the of the leek on St.David's Day. In the first, David advised Welsh fighting to support the British King Cadwaladyr to wear a leek the battle with the Saxons so that they could identify themselves.

legends, wearing warriors during The

second legend concerns a battle fought in a field of leeks between The Prince of Wales [Edward the Black Prince] and the French at the Battle of Crecy in 1346. After the battle the brave warriors wore leeks in their caps on St.David's Day, a legend recorded in Shakespeare's Henry V. Despite the bravery symbolised by leeks they became a source of caricature of 'Welshness' and another symbol of St.David, the daffodil, was adopted to restore the dignity of St.David's Day



during the 19th Century. The daffodil, a beautiful bright yellow Spring flower, tends to bloom around 1st March each year and was a widespread wild flower in Wales in the 19th Century. It was popularised by Lloyd George, who always wore the daffodil on 1st March, and more widely recognised following it's display at the investiture of the Prince of Wales in 1911. It was a choice made by social trends and has remained a popular symbol to this Century. At this year's Patronal Service at St.David's Church all symbols of his Welsh heritage will be in evidence, but particularly these two

plants associated with his life and birthplace. Daffodils will brighten up every window and the faint whiff of leeks will be detected during the prayers!

Bishop announces details of safeguarding review

Work is underway in the Diocese of Chester into Past Cases Review 2 (PCR2), a new national past cases review into the handling of safeguarding files in the Church.

PCR2 has a key focus of listening to survivors who want to come forward.

PCR2 follows on from an earlier review in 2007 and is part of the Church's ongoing scrutiny of its handling of past and current safeguarding cases.

The Bishop of Birkenhead, Keith Sinclair, announced details of PCR2 in a letter to all parishes on Monday 27 January, in which he outlined what parishes are required to do.

Bishop Keith, who leads on safeguarding in the Diocese of Chester says: "We want to ensure that all of our worshipping communities and church-related activities are as safe as possible for children and vulnerable adults. All dioceses have been asked to undertake and participate in this new review process which is known nationally as PCR2.

"It is important that all known cases of concern about the behaviour of clergy and church officers towards children and vulnerable adults have been considered and dealt with appropriately."

All information that is shared as part of PCR2 will be reviewed by an Independent Reviewer and appropriate action will be taken.

All parishes are required to respond to PCR2, which is commissioned by the Church of England and is being carried out in order to make our churches safer for everyone.
