## Dear Friends.

We are living in strange & uncertain times. As I write this, new information & guidelines are being issued on a regular basis from the Government & the Church of England with regards to the coronavirus. We are required to either wash or gel our hands as we arrive in church. During the Holy Communion service, only the Vicar will drink from the chalice but



we will continue to share in the bread. The shaking of hands during 'The Peace' is suspended until further notice.

The Church of England has also advised us not to continue with any catering, including teas & coffees. This will affect our Maundy Thursday Supper (although not the service), and our Coffee & Cake meetings for the time being. There is also rumoured to be a ban on mass gatherings in the near future, although I doubt that will affect our Sunday services!

All these things are sensible steps designed to protect as many of our congregation and our community as possible. Having said all that, we must keep things in perspective and as the famous quote says 'Keep Calm and Carry On'. It's at times like this that we need to remember our loved-ones but also to remember that we are part of a much larger family. There are many people in our communities who live alone and have no-one to share their worries and their concerns. The telephone is a vital lifeline for many. A friendly & reassuring voice can make all the difference when so many social activities are being curtailed. A listening ear is often all that is required. As Christians, we are very much aware that there is always a listening ear open to us. The power of prayer is not to be underestimated, whether we are gathered in church or sat quietly at home. As we gather to celebrate Easter this year, may we be uplifted and encouraged, knowing that we belong to the One who defeated the powers of death & lives for evermore. May we be aware of the presence of the Risen Christ in our lives through the good times and the bad. However uncertain things might feel, the one certainty is that we are never alone.

May God bless each and every one of us this Easter time,



## **Faustus**

A European folktale tells the story of a German alchemist, living in the 16th century, who made a pact with the devil. For 24 years he would have everything he wanted but at the end of that time the devil would claim his soul. The devil, according to the tale, kept his promise and for 24 years Faustus enjoyed fame, knowledge and the satisfaction of every desire. But the years rolled quickly by & Faustus was gripped with terrible foreboding as the end drew near. On his last night he met a fearful death as the devil claimed his soul for damnation.

An artist committed this tale to canvas. He depicted Faustus and the devil playing chess and he entitled it 'Checkmate'. The game is over and the devil has won. He gloats across the chess table at the doomed Faustus whose face is rigid with terror. The picture hung in a gallery and many people came to see it. One day a chess master came to view it. He gazed at it intently and then exclaimed "It's a lie! The game is not over! The king has another move!" The chess master noticed that Faustus still had his king. The king can yet bring victory out of seeming disaster. Jesus when he hung upon the cross appeared to have been defeated by the powers of evil and his enemies seemed to have won & were jubilant. He was gone! He was dead! He was buried! He would soon be forgotten. But they were all wrong! The game was not over! The King had another move! The King of Heaven raised His Son Jesus from death, to live forever in the power of an endless life.

Christians have been celebrating this great event for over 2000 years! ## Plants and Flowers in the Christian Faith

Sacred Plants: Thorns

At Easter Christians read Bible accounts of Jesus' crucifixion and the mocking gesture of the Roman soldiers in placing a 'Crown of Thorns' on his head as part of his humiliation. They demanded to know if he was 'The King of the Jews'.

There are many legends about the plants that may have been used to create the crown. In Palestine there are many thorny shrubs and trees which could have been used for the crown, so the exact species may never be truly identified. A plant from Madagascar, the thorny euphorbia [Euphorbia millii] is known as the 'Crown of Thorns'. It had already been taken to the Middle East before the time of Jesus' life and has thorny, pliable stems that could be woven together to create a crown.

Nearer to home a hawthorn known as the 'Glastonbury Thorn' grows on the Hill at Glastonbury and blooms twice yearly, at Winter and Spring. It is said to have been brought to England by Joseph of Arimathea, who gave his own tomb for Jesus' body when it was removed from the Cross. It is said to have grown from Joseph's staff, pushed into the ground, or from a thorn taken from the Crown of Thorns. Each year, on



December 8<sup>th</sup>, it provides a branch which is given to the Queen as part of her Christmas celebration. On that date in 2010 the tree was severely damaged in an act of vandalism, a source of anguish for the local people who had protected the tree for decades. There are many relics around the World which are said to be from the Crown of Thorns worn by Jesus. One relates to a crown taken from Jerusalem to Constantinople around 1063. It was eventually purchased by King Louis IX of France [ later known as Saint Louis], and taken to Paris in 1238. There he built the Sainte Chappell to house the relic, but it was eventually transferred to Notre Dame Cathedral and kept in the treasury. It survived the terrible fire in April 2019 and continues to be displayed on Fridays during Lent. Thorny plants are symbolic throughout the Bible. When Adam and Eve fell from Grace in the Garden of Eden part of the punishment for humanity was that the Earth would bring forth thorns and thistles. In placing a crown of thorns on Jesus' head the soldiers were mocking his status in relation to a monarch with power, status and glory. However, inadvertently, they were reflecting His identity as a King of Kings,who would rise from the dead to be immortal, something that every Christian reflects upon at Easter.

## **RECIPE**

# **Easter Biscuits**

#### Makes 24

## Ingredients

200g butter - softened 200g golden caster sugar 1 large egg 1/2tsp vanilla extract 400g plain flour plus extra for dusting



### Method

- Heat oven to 200c/180c fan/gas 6
- Line a baking sheet with paper
- Beat butter until soft & creamy
- Add sugar, egg & vanilla.
- Finally add flour to make a dough.
- Roll out on floured surface to thickness of 2x£1 coins.
- Cut out shapes & bake for 8-10mins or until edges are just brown.
- Leave to cool & decorate with food colouring gels or icing sugar
