#### Dear Friends.

#### A Kind of Resurrection

At the start of lockdown, the Bishops in the Church of England wrote about lockdown being a kind of long 'Holy Saturday'. Holy Saturday is the day between Good Friday and the Resurrection. It is an in-between place; a place of waiting and not knowing. Depending on our experience of lockdown (and each of our experiences

will be uniquely different), for some, the experience of lockdown and coronavirus will feel more like an extended Good Friday.

Whatever our experience of lockdown, or the coronavirus pandemic in general, we have reached a point where a kind of resurrection is taking place. However slowly and haltingly, we are finding our way out of lockdown and returning to some kind of life beyond our front doors.

It isn't the life we knew before lockdown, but it is a wider experience of life than we have known for some months. We might describe it as a kind of Resurrection. That may seem a strange comparison when we more readily think of the Resurrection of Jesus as an instant, triumphant, move from death to life. Of course, for Jesus, Resurrection was a single, decisive victorious defeat of death. Yet the accounts of Resurrection Morning in the four Gospels tell us that for Jesus' followers, Resurrection Morning was rather different.

Exhausted and grief-stricken, the disciples' experience of Resurrection Morning was anything but a swift, triumphant move from Good Friday to Easter Day. There were moments of understanding. John stood in the empty tomb and understood... and then fled for home, too terrified to tell anyone the good news. Mary Magdalene was so grief-stricken she failed to recognise the risen Jesus through her tears and the disciples who met Jesus on the Emmaus Road spent quite some time in his presence, all the while thinking the risen Jesus was a stranger to Jerusalem.

The disciples' experience of Resurrection morning was every bit as fearful, confusing and halting as our own journey out of lockdown as we learn to live alongside COVID-19. That does not mean Resurrection is not real. Life after Resurrection looked very different to the disciples, just as life after lockdown looks different to us. It will take us time to come to terms with what has happened, and get used to it. We will be confused, fearful and apprehensive, but we can still move slowly towards something new and positive.

I want to end with some words spoken by Vanessa Redgrave as the narrator, 'the older Jenny' at the end of the final episode of Series 9 of *Call the Midwife*.

"The world shifts around us, and we shape ourselves to fit. Imperfect and beautiful, wounded and thriving, delicate, invincible, for ever moving on. Time is not the tide. It moves in only one direction. Go forth in courage and in hope. Change is not loss. We must run with it. Dance with it. Give it all we have."

With my prayers as we continue to find our way in a changed world,

It is with great sadness that we learned of the death of **Mrs Ruth Brooks** of Village Farm on April  $30^{\text{th}}$ .


Ruth always gave us a warm welcome on our Rogation Sunday Walk, and she enjoyed taking part in the traditional short service at the farm.

#### Sacred Plants; The Rose

This small series of articles resumes with the sacred symbolism of the rose, and what could be more beautiful and restorative than a rose? Roses appear as symbolic flowers from the time of ancient Greece, where they represented the eternal love between the gods and humans.

Today the rose features in all the major religions, with Muslims believing that the rose represents the human soul and for Hindus and Buddhists the rose is a symbol of spiritual joy. The scent of roses in the air a sign that angels are bringing messages from God to Earth, and the Catholic faith terms it the odour of sanctity.

The rose is widely said to represent the Virgin Mary 'The Rose Without Thorns'. God is said to have placed thornless roses in the Garden of Eden, which developed thorns in response to human sin. When God redeemed the World, with the birth of Jesus to the Virgin, she became symbolised with the thornless roses of Eden. One of the most

famous miracles, associated with Mary, is the miracle of Our Lady of Guadalupe. In 1531 Mary is believed to have arranged roses on the clothing of Juan Diego to create an image of herself in the form of an angel. Seeing and

hearing about this image resulted in millions of South Americans coming to Christianity.

We are familiar with the term 'rosary' in Christianity. The term means 'crown of roses' and symbolises offering prayers to Mary as a bouquet of roses. The beads known as a 'rosary' are held during prayers to focus the mind onto the circle of prayers and the miracles associated with Jesus' life.

Here in Cheshire the soil is ideal for roses, and we can create our own slice of Eden. The Ispahan rose is a Damask rose, originating in the Persian [Iran] city of Ispahan in the 13<sup>th</sup> century. It is known for it's strong, sweet perfume and silky pink colour. What could better represent Mary and uplift us more during this strange year?

Thanks to all who have contributed to the CCC – it has, and continues to be, our **outreach** whilst staying in.



#### Stay Aware, Stay Safe

Unfortunately in these already difficult times, staying safe is not just about observing social distancing, wearing masks and keeping our hands clean. We also need to be ever vigilant with regard to emails, phone calls & text messages. The unscrupulous out there see Covid 19 as just another vehicle to exploit, to steal from us.

I was reading an article last night saying that gmail, last week alone stopped 18 million Covid related scam emails from getting through. That is one email provider think about how many others there are. There have been reports of people being phoned and told they have been in contact with someone who has tested positive and that they need to be tested and put on the track and trace scheme, they are then asked to give card or bank details for a payment to get the necessary information pack, there is no such pack. Others have received text messages saying they are due a tax refund or some other form of relief payment, just fill in your bank details and the payment will be made. The only payment made will be them emptying your bank account in to theirs.

#### Simple Rules to Follow.

**Don't** click on links in emails or social media unless you are 100% sure it's genuine, even if the sender is 'known' to you (email addresses of friends and businesses are easy to spoof), check by a separate phone call, that the email is genuine.

Don't give bank or card details to someone who phones you.

Don't click on links in text messages.

Follow the mantra of Watchdog "If it's out of the blue, it's not for you".

#### Recipe

#### Slow Cooked Margarita Beef

Cook time: 4-6 Hours Serves: 4-5

#### Ingredients

1 Kg Ash House Pot Roast / Brisket 250ml Tequila Juice of 4 Limes Zest of 1 Lime 1 tsp Granulated Garlic 2 tsp Granulated Sugar Salt and pepper to taste



#### Method

- Pan sear the joint in a frying pan, and then baste with the other ingredients.
- Add all the ingredients to a roasting dish, cover and then roast for 4-6 hours
- Uncover for the last half hour and turn the heat up to 180.
- Remove from the oven, cover, and leave to rest while you prepare your desired accompaniments.
- Once ready, use two forks to shred the beef.
- Serve on your choice of tacos, wraps, pitta breads, salad or as an addition to your preferred summer side dishes and enjoy.
- For a moreish dipping sauce reduce the pan juices to accompany the dish.
