St David: The Patron Saint of Little Things



No-one knows quite why Wettenhall Church is dedicated to St David (if you do, I'd love to know). Neither do we know if we will be able to gather together as 4 churches to celebrate St David's Day, although it looks unlikely as I write. Thankfully neither of those things change the fact that St David is a saint for these times.

St David is sometimes known as 'the saint of little things'. This comes from something which he said in his final sermon when he told the monks in his monastery to 'Do the little things, the small things you've seen me doing'.

Over the last year, we have come to value the little things. The acts of kindness as family and friends have done shopping, picked up prescriptions, dropped off unexpected treats. We have learned to appreciate bird song, walks in our local neighbourhoods and the beauty of the countryside on our doorsteps, the small changes which mark the changes of the seasons.

We have also learned how important things we previously thought were so small we barely noticed them are; seeing family and friends, the supportive hug, hand on the shoulder or squeeze of the hand; coffee and cake shared in a favourite café.

It is my hope that, if nothing else, we will have learned as a result of COVID-19 the value of the small things and the value of taking time not to rush through life so fast that we miss the things we now know are really important.


We might learn too, the value of doing the little things; the small things. Speaking about St David, Rowan Williams, the former Archbishop of Canterbury said that St David's words appealed to modern people because: 'It reminds us that the primary things for us are the relationships around us, the need to work at what's under our hands, what's within our reach.

'We can transform our domestic, our family relationships, our national life, to some extent, if we do that with focus and concentration in the presence of God'.

None of us can transform the world single handed, but with the help of God, we can follow St David's example and 'do the little things.' After all, the only thing God asks of any of us is that we do what we can, with what we have, where we are. If we do that in the name of Jesus, we will achieve great things indeed.


World Book Day



Sacred Plants: The Vine

The growth of vines, tending of vineyards, and the production of grapes and wine are referred to throughout the Old Testament and the New Testament. This is not surprising, because vines were known to be widely cultivated in Palestine before the arrival of the Israelites. The first mention of vines is in Genesis and the story of Noah. with further references in the books of Isaiah, Jeremiah and Ezekiel. The people of Israel are themselves referred to as the vine because they are faithful to God, the fruits of the vine representing their fruitfulness in God's work on Earth. However, the worthless wood of the vine is also used to symbolise the disobedient Judah, demonstrating it's use as a positive or negative allegory, depending on the context



In the New Testament, and the beginning of Jesus's ministry, His first recorded miracle is the changing of water into wine at the wedding in Cana. The huge volume of beautiful wine for the guests was created after a request from Mary, despite Jesus seeming to be reluctant to use his miraculous powers in this way. However, from then on, Jesus started to use the vine, grapes and wine to represent himself and the growing church around him. In the

Gospel of Matthew, Jesus refers to the church as a vineyard which has been planted and hedged around. In Psalm 80 the church is again compared to a vine. The grapes represent the Earthly good works of Jesus.



The painting of the Last Supper, by Leonardo Da Vinci, and the passages in the Bible referring to Jesus sharing a meal with his disciples before being betraved. and arrested are familiar to us all. He is reported to have taken bread and said 'Take, eat, this is my body' then taking a cup said 'Drink from it, all of you. For this is my blood, and never again shall I drink from the fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it with you in the Kingdom of my Father' Jesus is forever linked divinely with bread and wine. The Church year is now leading us to the final months of Jesus' life on Earth, and to His fateful Last Supper, leaving the Eucharist as his symbol for all Christians

Recipe

Sichuan pepper beef stir-fry

Serves 2

Ingredients

For the marinade

- 1 tbsp Shaoxing rice wine or dry sherry
- 2 tsp ground Sichuan pepper
- 1 tsp dark soy sauce
- ½ tsp Chinese five-spice powder
- 2 garlic cloves, crushed and finely chopped
- 2 steaks, cut into strips

For the stir fry

- 2 tbsp groundnut oil
- 1 medium red chilli, de-seeded and chopped
- ½ onion, chopped
- 1 small handful broccoli, cut into small pieces
- 1 small handful mange-tout, chopped
- 1 small handful carrots, sliced into half-rounds 1 small handful baby sweetcorn, halved
- 300ml/11fl oz hot fresh beef or vegetable stock
- 1 tbsp light soy sauce
- 1 tbsp cornflour mixed with 2 tbsp cold water
- 1 spring onion, finely sliced
- Salt and ground white pepper

To serve

Rice

Method

- · Mix all the marinade ingredients, except the beef, in a bowl. Add the strips of beef, mix well and leave to marinate for as long as possible. ideally overnight.
- · For the stir fry, heat a wok over high heat and add the oil. Add the marinated beef and stir-fry for two minutes.
- · Add the red chilli and onion and stir-fry for less than a minute then add the rest of the vegetables and stir-fry for another minute.
- · Add the hot stock and stir well. Add the light sov sauce to season.
- · Bring to the boil, add the cornflour and water paste and stir to mix thoroughly.
- Add the spring onion, season to taste with the salt and ground white pepper.
- · Serve with rice.
