High Hopes and Disappointments

As I was thinking what to write, and enjoying the June sunshine shining into my study, I wondered how long it would be before someone complained they were too warm... then the phone rang and it happened. The person I was talking to complained they were too hot.

After a long, challenging winter and a slow, cold spring, we have been longing for the warmth of summer, with the usual high expectations of everything summer holds... Yet this year, as so often, when it arrives it doesn't quite live up to expectation. We long for the warmth, only to be reminded how uncomfortable our frequently humid heat is; we long for light evenings only to realise we are too busy to enjoy them; we long for the full, lush vegetation of summer only to remember the reality of itchy eyes, runny noses and sneezes of hay fever.

Our changeable weather certainly gives us something to talk about, it also brings high hopes only for the reality to fall so far short it is a disappointment. Whether it is deep snow, warm summers or crisp autumn days it rarely measures up to our expectation and collective memory.

The weather is not the only thing which disappoints us in life. As I write there are very high expectations of a life without restrictions; of a return to 'normal life'; large weddings; social gatherings without masks, hugs from our family and friends. Whether those expectations will be met, we do not yet know.

Thankfully there is one area in which our high hopes and expectations are rewarded. Far from being a game of chance with high expectations and dashed hopes, the life of faith is sure and certain. It is perhaps the only area of life in which we can say that with absolute certainty and know that our high hopes will not be dashed.

The definition of faith is *'the assurance of things hoped for and the conviction of things not seen.'* (Hebrews 11: 1). This means that we can live in the sure and certain hope of eternal life in our Lord Jesus Christ which the funeral service speaks of with such confidence. Here is something which we can be confident will not disappoint, however high we set our hopes.

However high our hopes of summer and of life without COVID-restrictions may be; whether they are fulfilled or not, we can move forward with confidence, knowing that the hope of eternal life will never disappoint or fail us when we place our trust in Jesus Christ.

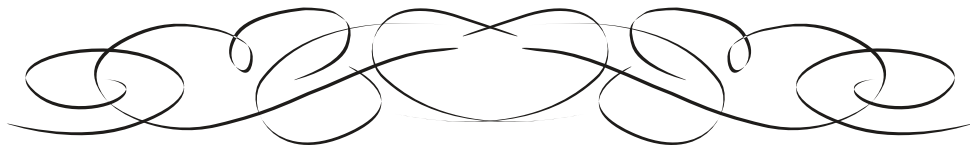

We had a party celebrating the Queens 95th birthday and all the girls came dressed in red, white and blue.



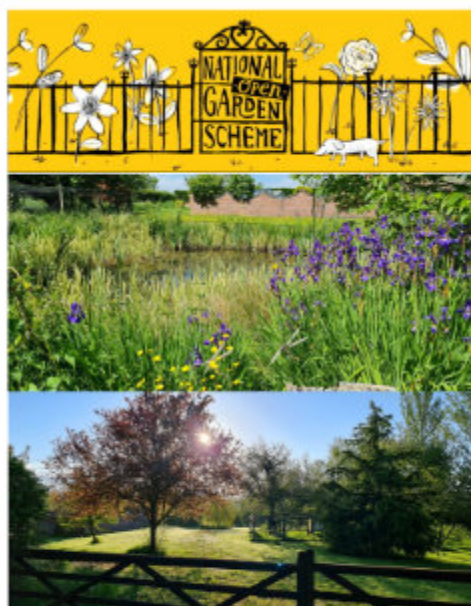
Milford House Farm

Open Garden

24th July 2021

In 2020 the garden at Milford House Farm opened as part of the National Garden Scheme. The planned June 2020 date had to be cancelled because of the Covid pandemic restrictions, but we did manage to open in early September. Despite all the problems last year, and the hard work involved, it was decided to take the plunge again this year. When the opening date was chosen it was in the belief that the lockdowns would be a thing of the past and that the weather would be as kind as 2020. Wrong on both accounts!

On Saturday 24th July we will open the garden from 12 noon to 5pm. Booking is optional this year, but we are still planning to keep everyone as safe as possible with refreshments in the marquee in the garden and arrangements such as disposable plates for your delicious cakes. The money received for refreshments will be donated to the local branch of the Motor Neurone Disease charity, the money from the gate [£4.00 per person, children free] and plant sales will go to the National Garden Scheme, which is the main supporter of the Macmillan Nurses and also contributes to many other causes such as the Queen's Nursing Institute. It would be lovely to meet people from the Cross Country Parishes at the open garden in July, if only to discuss the difficulty of gardening on Wottenhall clay whilst eating a piece of homemade cake.

Sacred Plants: The Lotus Flower

The sacred lotus, a waterlily originating in Southern Asia and Australia, is known and grown throughout the World. It has showy white or pink flowers and waxy green leaves. The buds rise above the water for three days before opening at daylight and closing each night, sinking down into the water. These plants have existed for millions of years and survived the Ice Age which led to the extinction of many plants



throughout the World. Today the lotus is still the subject of careful selection and propagation to enable it to be grown in many different climate zones. It is said to be the World's most sacred plant, having religious symbolism from Ancient Egypt through to Christianity, Buddhism and Hinduism.

Perhaps it all began in Ancient Egypt, where lotus flowers were represented in hieroglyphics to unite upper and lower Egypt and where the Book of the Dead included spells to transform a person into a lotus flower.

In Christianity the deep roots of the lotus represents God's deep love for the people. The flowers rising from the water and the opening and closing of the buds represent Jesus and his birth, crucifixion and resurrection. Beyond Christianity the lotus is particularly associated with Buddhism, representing spiritual awakening, purity and faithfulness.

The flowers rising from muddy waters represent the acts of believers rising above the challenges of life and moving towards light and wisdom. The pink lotus is the essence of Buddhism, the petals representing his birth and body. Purple flowers represent his teachings and the Noble Eightfold Path. The white lotus is purity and blue flowers symbolize the power of the spirit over knowledge and wisdom.

India's National flower is the lotus, the famous symbol of Hinduism and the ability of the faithful to fulfil duty without regard for desire, pleasure or personal gain. Hindus believe that Lord Brahma appeared from Lord Vishnu sitting on a lotus pad, while the goddesses Saraswati and Lakshmi are also lotus flowers. All of the World's lotus flowers are tropical plants and would only survive in Britain in a hot greenhouse. Lotus flowers are now being developed in India which are able to

survive cooler conditions or are very small and can be grown as a pot plant. So perhaps we will eventually grow them in our



garden ponds and living rooms to enjoy their great beauty and reflect on their sacred symbolism.

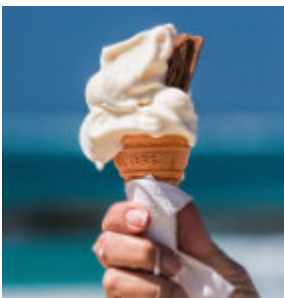
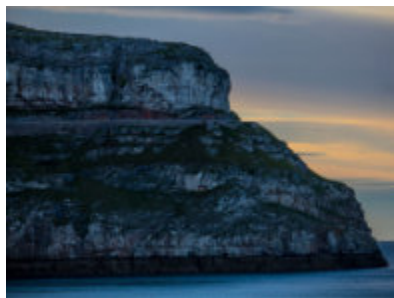

Introducing two new Bishops

Your new bishops
of Birkenhead and
Stockport

The Venerable Julie Conalty will
be the next Bishop of
Birkenhead, and the Revd
Canon Sam Corley will be the
next Bishop of Stockport,
Downing Street has announced.



The Venerable Julie Conalty, Archdeacon of Tonbridge and Bishop-Designate of Birkenhead

Julie grew up in the North West of England but has spent the last 35 years "exiled" in the south. She first experienced a call to ordained ministry as a teenager and when she finished school she moved to Sheffield to study for a Biblical Studies degree. Upon graduation, as women could not train to become priests, Julie found work running a homeless shelter, trained as a social worker and began a career in the Probation Service in London. Eventually, she was accepted for ordination training and was ordained deacon in 1999 and priest in 2000. Her training parish was in Southwark Diocese and she was initially a self-supporting minister while continuing her secular work.

Subsequently, she worked for the Youth Justice Board before becoming the national manager of a resettlement project and then a Local Authority manager for Specialist Youth Services. She also founded a consultancy partnership and somewhere amidst all of that found the time to study Applied Theology.

In 2010, Julie transferred to Stipendiary Ministry, giving up her "day job" and taking up a post in a newly formed United Benefice in southeast London. In 2012 she became vicar of Christ Church, Erith

in the Diocese of Rochester. She also served as the Bishop's Advisor for the Ministry of Ordained Women and Area Dean of Erith. She was made an Honorary Canon of Rochester Cathedral in 2016. Julie was appointed as Archdeacon of Tonbridge in September 2017.

She held the position of the Bishop of Rochester's Lead for Safeguarding for three years. She has also been a member of the General Synod of the Church of England since November 2013.

The Bishop of Rochester, James Langstaff welcomed the news of Julie's appointment:

"Archdeacon Julie has given a huge amount to our diocese in a relatively short amount of time, serving first as vicar of Christ Church Erith and Area Dean of Erith. She's also been my adviser for the Ministry of Ordained Women, and alongside being Archdeacon of Tonbridge, has held the significant role of Bishop's Lead for Safeguarding".

"Her own passion and desire to see safeguarding work taken seriously has been of huge importance, changing not just processes, but also culture within the diocese. She would agree there is still a long way to go, but her contribution in this area has been hugely valuable.

"We assure her of our prayers as she takes on this new ministry."

Julie is married to Simon and they have two grown-up sons. Julie likes a beer and a takeaway curry on a Friday night and the whole family support Charlton Athletic.

"In an attempt to get some exercise" she goes walking in the countryside. During the lockdown Julie and Simon have been playing Settlers of Catan and Ticket to Ride "seemingly ad infinitum". She has even resorted to embroidery and completed one jigsaw.

The Revd Canon Sam Corley and Bishop Designate of Stockport

was licensed as Rector of Leeds in 2015. He is the former Precentor of Bradford Cathedral, a role he took up in 2011. He was also Senior Chaplain to the University of Bradford and Faith Advisor to the Lord Mayor of Bradford.

Sam read theology at the University of Durham and taught history in Surrey before training for the ministry at St John's College Nottingham.

The Bishop of Leeds, Nick Baines thanked Sam for his ten years of energetic service in the region:

"Sam has served the Diocese of Leeds and the wider Church of England in a variety of capacities with great diligence, wisdom, and generosity."

"He has inspired many people to greater vision and ministry within and beyond the Church. His appointment to the See of Stockport is wonderful for the Church, the wider community in the Diocese of Chester, and the bishops nationally.

"I am very sorry to be losing him but very confident that his ministry will continue to grow in the future."

In 2004 he was ordained in the Diocese of Blackburn, where he became a parish priest and Assistant Diocesan Missioner. Sam says he's comfortable in a wide range of worship contexts - including leading worship for 2000 scouts in a cowshed at the Great Yorkshire Showground.

He enjoys working with people of all faiths, backgrounds, and ages and has lots of experience of working with young people, having led over 30 residential holidays for teenagers.

Since 2009 Sam has been a Bishops' Advisor and Panel Secretary for Bishops' Advisory Panels - the national process by which candidates are selected for ordination. More recently he has been an Executive Member and Director of the Association of English Cathedrals and has delivered training in governance for clergy and laypeople who are new to their roles in leading Cathedrals.

Sam is married to Claire, who is herself in ordained ministry within the Church of England, and they have three children.

Having spent much of his childhood working on a farm, Sam also has a deep love of the countryside and nature.

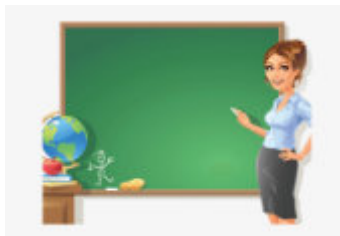


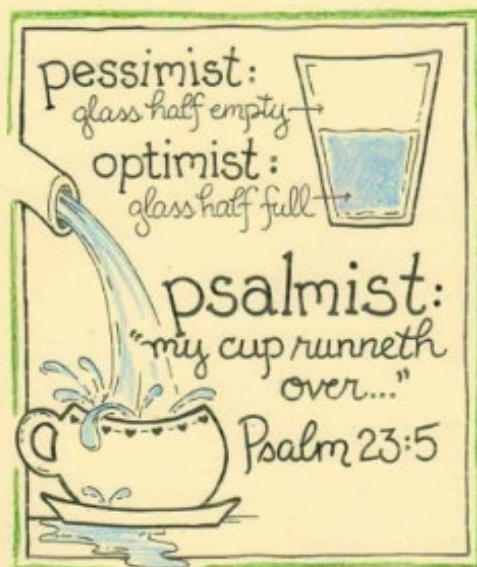

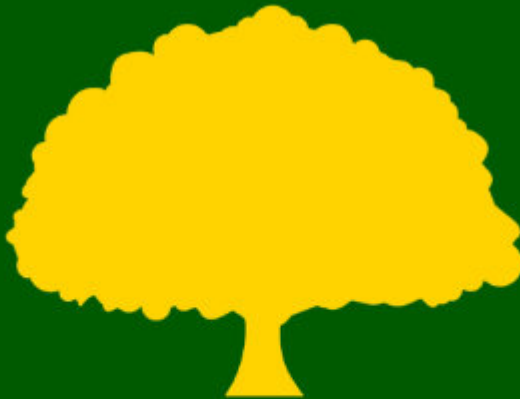

Recipe

Garlic Butter Salmon

Serves 4

Ingredients

4 Salmon portions
2tbsp of lemon juice, honey, melted butter,
paprika & 2 pressed garlic cloves

For the rice- enough long grain for 4

1 tsp orange zest + half a cup of juice

1 tsp soy sauce

Salt & pepper to taste & chopped parsley
to decorate.

Method

- Heat oven 400F or use foil on BBQ for the salmon
- Combine orange zest, juice, soy sauce, 1 1/2 cups water & pinch of salt & pepper. Bring to the boil & add the rice. Cover until the water is absorbed & rice is tender.
- Whisk together the lemon juice, honey, butter, paprika, garlic, salt & pepper.
- Place salmon on a lined baking tray (or foil) Drizzle with butter mixture. Roast for 12-18mins until the salmon is opaque.
- Serve with rice & sprinkled with chopped parsley
