#### Dear Friends,



Have you noticed that recently special days have become special weeks, even special months? You can think of lots of examples: Red Nose Day, World Book Day, Christian Aid Week, Stoptober, Dry January, Carer's Week... and many more. In the Church, November could be called Remembrance Month. It starts on November 1st with All Saints Day, when we remember those important people who have the title "Saint". November 2nd is All Souls Day which is our day to remember people who have died and are significant even if we wouldn't call them saints. They are important and dear to us, family and friends. On the 11th of November, or on the Sunday closest, we have Remembrance Sunday to remember those who have died in war and conflict.

Possibly the one we forget about is every Sunday when a Communion Service takes place, when we hear those words, "Do this in remembrance of me". Remembrance in this context is special because it means bringing into the present what is important about the person, Jesus, we are remembering.

Of course, there is another act of remembrance, on November 5th, many people will celebrate Bonfire Night remembering the Gunpowder Plot. November 5th also happens to be a special day for me. It's the anniversary when I remember my last service as vicar of the Cross-country Parishes, at Acton, fifteen years ago. I always said I would go out with a bang! The last hymn of my last service was "In Christ alone my hope is found." The final lines are, for me the most powerful:

"No power of hell, no scheme of man, Can ever pluck me from His hand: Till He returns or calls me home, Here in the power of Christ I'll stand."

I think as Christians, that is a call to all of us to continue to stand, remember and make real the power of Christ in our world.



#### Sacred Gardens: The Garden of Gethsemane

We are getting closer to Christmas now, with the birth of Jesus and the start of his Earthly life, but that life came to a cruel end in the Garden of Gethsemane and started the growth of the Christian faith across the World. The Garden of Gethsemane translates as a



garden with an olive press and is located at the foot of the Mount of Olives, a hill across the Kidron Valley from the Old City of Jerusalem. It is said to be an area well known and visited by Jesus and his disciples, a shaded grove of olive trees in which to meet, rest and discuss their ministry. That may be the reason that Judas chose to betray Jesus close to the Garden, he knew where Jesus and the inner circle of

disciples, Peter, James and John would go after the betrayal. In the Garden Jesus was said to be deeply distressed and knelt to pray for the relief of his anguish and agony. The olive press may even symbolise the pressure bearing down on him in the final hours of his life.

The stories of Jesus's final hours, the pathway taken as he made his way to the site of crucifixion, and the prayers in the darkened olive grove led to the site becoming an area of pilgrimage in the early years of the Church. By the year 333 an anonymous 'pilgrim of Bordeaux' recorded his experiences as a

Christian traveller in the Holy Land. The Garden of Gethsemane became more well known as

various Holy Wars spread across the Middle East and Europe. In 1681 three Croatian knights of the Holy Order of Jerusalem, Paul, Antum and James, purchased the Garden and donated it to the Franciscan community. They still own it now, the donation recorded by a plate on the

entrance to the land.

The Garden is walled around the area of the Church of All Nations. In 2014 an archaeological survey determined that the foundations were those of a 1,500 year old Byzantine church and included a ritual bathing site. A floor inscription said that the church was for the 'Memory and repose of the lovers of Christ' There are four different holy locations, claimed by different Christian traditions, within Gethsemane. The Catholic Church has the Church of All the Nations, said to be built over the Rock of Agony where Jesus prayed. The Eastern Orthodox tradition claims that the Kidron Valley is also the location of the Tomb of the Virgin Mary before she ascended to

Heaven. The Greek Orthodox Church honours the Eastern slopes of the valley, while the Russian Orthodox Church believes that Jesus prayed in the area of the Tomb of Mary Magdalene across the valley. Wherever the exact location of Jesus' agony it is remarkable that we can still visit the Garden of Gethsemane to feel so close to him and the disciples in their fellowship and ministry.

Throughout the past two years we have had worship and lots of sharing of information and news on our Cross Country WhatsApp Group. It has been an important part of my spirituality especially when our churches were closed. Recently I have had a major operation and once again our CCC Worship has become a link to our Church family while I haven't been able to drive. It got me thinking, the app is so easy to call up, how could we use it more? Advent is perhaps the most overlooked season in the Church's year. #### **Cheshire East Community Governance Review**

Cheshire East are currently holding a 12-week consultation on proposals for the governance arrangements for town and parish councils in the borough. The <u>Community Governance Review draft recommendations</u> report makes a series of proposals, with accompanying maps; Wettenhall and Cholmondeston Parishes form part of this consultation and residents are encouraged to participate.

Cheshire East considers that the current grouping arrangement probably serves no practical benefit to the parish council or to the community and electors.

The Borough Council considers that a parish of six councillors is at risk of being unable to conduct its business, therefore favours the view of the National Association of Local Councils that a preferred minimum number of seats on a parish council is seven. It is therefore proposed that the total number of seats on the new parish council be increased from six to seven.

Wettenhall 4 Councillors (increase of +1) Cholmondeston 3 Councillors (no increase) A name for the new parish should be considered, and the Borough Council welcomes proposals on this point.

The Council also requests comments on whether the new parish should have the style of 'parish' or one of the alternative styles that the Council may recommend where a new parish is being created: 'community', 'neighbourhood' or 'village'.

The public consultation started on 6 September. The consultation ends at midnight on 28 November 2021. Paper copies of the consultation can also be obtained from local libraries. For any queries about the survey,

This buddy system is very powerful in creating a Christian family environment as well as helping the younger ones get in some of those valuable reading miles!















#### **Owls Class:**

Owls Class is our Nursery and Reception children who have settled in so well to their start to St. Oswald's. They stole the show at the school Harvest Service when they came dressed as sheaves of corn and a 'Big Red Combine Harvester' and sang so beautifully in front of the whole school and their parents.

#### **Deers Class:**

Deers Class are our Infant children at St. Oswald's who have been working hard with their Autumn poetry and producing some lovely verses about Autumn using all their senses to describe how it looks, smells, sounds and feels.

#### **Hedgehog Class:**

Hedgehog Class are our youngest junior class of children (Year 3&4) who have been involved in a very tense Times Table Rockstar battle which is an online times tables game that involves an element of competition. The children did so well and all came dressed as rockstars to celebrate their successes in the Times Tables Competition.

We brought our favourite toys into school this week and shared them during show and tell. We enjoyed talking about our favourite toy and answering questions. We have also been learning all about Autumn, we went on an Autumn walk and collected leaves and acorns from

the school grounds.
Children in years 1 - 6 have been really enjoying their weekly swimming lessons! It has been great to see the children growing in confidence each week and having fun in the water.
The children took part in Hello Yellow Day to celebrate the World Mental

Health Day.



#### Recipe

#### **Almond Slices**

#### Ingredients

85g butter
Shortcrust pastry - enough to line a Swiss
Roll tin

Jam

50g semolina

50g ground almonds

125g caster sugar

1 egg - beaten

Half teaspoon almond extract

15g flaked almonds



#### Method

- Preheat the oven to 160'C, fan 140'C, gas mark 3
- Line the Swiss Roll tin with pastry
- Spread jam raspberry or cherry is nice
  over the pastry
- Melt the butter and mix together with the semolina, ground almonds, caster sugar, beaten egg and almond extract.
- Spread the mixture evenly over the jam in the pastry case.
- Scatter the flaked almonds over the mixture
- Bake in the centre of the oven for 30-40 minutes, or until golden brown and the sponge is springy to touch.
- Leave in the tin for 10 minutes before cutting into slices.


