Dear Friends

I have just been looking again at a favourite book of mine. It is **The Lion Storyteller Christmas Book.** 

It is for children of course, and has three sections - Christmas Stories from the Bible, Stories about Christmas Traditions, and Christmas Tales and Legends. Some stories in the second and third sections usually make children smile. There are naughty children with whom they can identify - and good ones too. A favourite, when I was teaching, was a story from Russia about an old shoemaker called Papa Panov. He was all alone by the fire on Christmas Eve and he read again the story of the first Christmas in his Bible. It was the story of Mary and Joseph and the baby Jesus. He fell asleep and dreamed that the grown up Jesus came and promised to visit him on Christmas Day so that he wouldn't be lonely.

Papa Panov spent Christmas day giving hot food and drink to the street sweeper, a beggar girl with a baby, and then more poor people, but by nightfall Jesus had not come. Papa Panov, was tired, sad and even more lonely and he dozed off by the fire. Suddenly Jesus was there beside him, and he thanked Papa Panov. 'What are you thanking me for?' asked Papa Panov. 'What did I do for you?' 'You took in the hungry and poor and lonely and shared what you had. That is what my friends do' answered Jesus. 'Thank you.' And then he disappeared. Papa Panov was content.

The compiler of this book of lovely stories, Bob Hartman, writes of the privilege of sharing the story of Christmas with children. If you have children or grand children or there are any children you know, then make sure that they know the story of the first Christmas. Then this story gets passed on. A new generation will hear of God's love for us.

If you bring those children to church on Christmas Eve they will hear the story - the story of Mary and Joseph, shepherds and kings, and that special baby who came to be our Saviour.

Whatever anyone says, that story can never be cancelled! Happy Christmas.

### Sacred Gardens: Garden of Empty Tomb

### The Garden of the Empty Tomb

The Garden of the Empty Tomb is said to be the place where Jesus' was buried after his death and where his resurrection took place. The tomb was empty when it was visited by Mary Magdalene and Mary, the mother of James and Joseph, on the third day after the crucifixion. The site was discovered in 1867 and has been

dated to 8<sup>th</sup> – 7<sup>th</sup> century BC, a time when tombs were frequently reused for burials over many years. However, the Bible says that Joseph of Arimathea purchased a new tomb for Jesus prior to the execution. [Matthew 27]. The Garden of Gethsemane has the Church of the Holy Sepulchre built over a site which is also said to be the tomb of Jesus. It is said by some scholars that the Garden of the Empty Tomb is

the more authentic site of the burial and has not been damaged and altered over the centuries, unlike the Holy Sepulchre. The Garden of the Empty Tomb has a rocky area which is known as Golgotha, it's skull like appearance giving it its name [Golgotha is the Aramaic for skull] and from its situation the Temple, Mount of Olives and much of Jerusalem can be seen. However, the Church of the Holy Sepulchre has been regarded as Jesus' tomb since the 4<sup>th</sup> Century AD. Much of the discussion regarding these two sites is related to their ownership and maintenance. The Holy Sepulchre is related to the Catholic faith, the Garden Tomb to the Protestant faith.

The Garden Tomb lies within the city walls of Jerusalem and Jesus was said to have been

executed outside the city walls. However, Hadrian was said to have brought Golgotha into the city when he constructed new walls in the 2<sup>nd</sup> century AD. To confuse the matter further a Dr Edward Robinson argued in 1841 that Jesus would have been executed outside the city on the road to Damascus. The Garden Tomb lies close to this road and only 200 metres from the Damascus Gate. The rocky Golgotha area is also close to the Antonia Fortress, said to be the place of Jesus' trial.



We will probably never know for sure exactly where Jesus was tried, executed and buried. In many ways these details are not the foundation of the Christian faith, it is the resurrection itself which is the Church's foundation and source of Christ's power and glory, wherever it took place.



We conducted a whole school assembly to remind the children what Remembrance Day is all about and why people choose to wear Poppies to remember. Mr Goodwin and the children of the school council, Head Girl and Head Boy then conducted a small act of remembrance at the War Memorial at St. Oswald's Church. A wreath was laid for Pte Edward Griffiths who was a pupil at the school when it first opened in the late 1800s before going on to serve with the Cheshire Yeomanry during the 1st World War and making the ultimate sacrifice in Palestine, where his war grave is. His name is written upon the War Memorial at St. Oswald's Church and one of his living relatives, Trevor Ray, his grandson, joined us to lay a wreath to remember Pte Griffiths.

### Recipe

### **Autumn Beef Stew**

Prep Time: 45 mins. Cook Time: 2 hours. Serves 8

### Ingredients

1/4 cup of white flour

1 ½ tsp salt

1 tsp cracked black pepper

900g Ash House Beef Chuck (diced into 1 1/4" chunks)

2 strips bacon (cut into 1/4" strips)

2 medium onions (cut into ½" wedges)

4 cloves garlic (peeled & smashed)

2 tbsp tomato paste

1L chicken stock 800 ml beef stock

400 ml dry red wine

3 bay leaves

1 tsp dried thyme (or 1 fresh sprig)

1 tsp smoked paprika

450g potatoes (cut into 2" chunks)

450g butternut squash (peeled & sliced into 1 1/2" chunks)

4 carrots (cut into 1" chunks)

2 celery stalks (cut into 1 inch chunks)

### Method

- In a large bowl, combine flour, salt & pepper. Add the beef until coated evenly.
- In a large heavy pot, cook & stir the bacon over a medium heat until crisp. Remove the bacon & add 1 tbsp oil. When hot shake the excess flour from the beef and add to the pan, Stir occasionally till browned, Remove
- · Add the onions to the pot & stir till browned. Stir in the garlic & tomato paste for 1 min & then return the bacon, beef & any remaining flour to the mix. Stir till combined then add the chicken, beef stock, red wine, bay leaves. thyme & paprika.
- Bring to a boil, reduce to a simmer & cover for 1 ½ hours or until the meat is tender.
- Add potatoes, carrots, celery & squash, then return to a boil. Reduce the heat & allow to simmer for 15 mins covered
- Remove the lid and allow to simmer for another 15 mins or until vegetables are tender & liquid is the desired consistency. Remove the bay leaves.
- · Serve with rice, a fresh crusty loaf or by itself and enjoy!

Our organist at St Oswald's, **Geoff Heap**, has had an extended stay in hospital. All his friends in Worleston send their best wishes for a speedy recovery.


