At the beginning of February our churches celebrate the Presentation of Christ or Candlemas. It's documented in Luke chapter 2 verses 25-40 and tells of Mary & Joseph bringing the

baby Jesus into the temple in Jerusalem. They were obviously not a wealthy couple as their offering was just two turtle doves - or the Offering of the Poor. However, they were greeted with great excitement by the old man Simeon, who recognised the baby as being a 'Light' to the world.

There is something truly beautiful about light. We see it reflected in the faces of children as they see Christmas lights for the first time.

We look forward to the changing of the seasons, bringing us more daylight hours. We welcome the dawn of each new day with all the anticipation and perhaps even the challenges it sets out before us.

We learnt that human beings can't control everything and are not invincible kings of the world. Infection, illness, bereavement, death & isolation can't be organised according to our convenience.

The Bible tells us that the child Jesus, was born into a land under oppression & fear. He was born into a family knowing the hardship of poverty and the discrimination created by His unusual birth. He was to suffer persecution and know the pain of loss and bereavement. Yet, Simeon knew that this child was to be the salvation of all people.Simeon realised that this was the long-awaited child promised to redeem the world. His description of Jesus as a light is a powerful metaphor.

When we find ourselves struggling through difficult times, we need to remind ourselves that however dark circumstances seem to be, the light of God's presence cannot be snuffed out.

May we keep the brightness of His light in our hearts, minds and in our lives as we journey through this coming year.

Desmond Mpilo Tutu OMSG CH GCStJ (7 October 1931 – 26 December 2021) was a South African Anglican bishop and theologian, known for his work as an antiapartheid and human rights activist. He was Bishop of Johannesburg from 1985 to 1986 and then Archbishop of Cape Town from 1986 to 1996, in both cases being the first black African to hold the position. Theologically, he sought to fuse ideas from black theology with African theology.

St Valentine February 14th

We all know about the Feast of St. Valentine on February 14th, celebrated throughout the Western world. The hearts, flowers, cards and pink cakes brighten up a time of year which is often cold, dark and wet.

There are several stories about Valentine, but most say that he was a 3rd century Bishop or priest in Terni, in Italy. He supported Christians, and evangelized for Jesus, at a time when Christians were a persecuted minority.



He is said to have married Christian couples which meant that the men could not be conscripted into the pagan Roman army. At each marriage the couples were given heart shaped messages to commemorate the ceremony. Valentine was

arrested and put under house arrest with Judge Asterius, who had a blind daughter. After discussing Valentine's faith, the judge tested him by asking him to restore the sight of the girl in Jesus' name. Valentine did restore her sight and the judge, and all his household, were baptized into the Christian faith.

Valentine continued to evangelize and was arrested again and transferred to Rome, to the Emperor Claudius II. The two men developed a friendship, but when Valentine tried to convert Claudius to Christianity he was condemned to death for his actions. Valentine wrote to Judge Asterius's daughter to tell her of his situation and is said to have signed off his message with the words '.....from your Valentine', the inspiration for our own cards and letters each year.

Valentine refused to deny his faith and was beaten and beheaded on February 14th 269. He was buried outside the Flaminian Gate in Rome. It may be rather gruesome for Valentine's Day, but his skull is displayed in the Basilica of the Santa Maria in Cosmedin in Rome. It wears a crown of flowers. Nearer to home there are other relics of the saint in Whitefriar Street Carmelite Church in Dublin, a busy location every February. Think about all the happiness, mystery and romance we would have missed every year if St. Valentine had never conducted those marriages in Rome in the 3rd Century. If you celebrate his Feast Day with a special meal, raise a toast to his faith and martyrdom.

Recipe

Spicy Pork Casserole with Apricots

Serves 6

Ingredients

2oz/50g dried apricots 1/4pint/150mls chicken stock 1 pint/570ml dry cider Juice of 2 oranges -4-6 tablespoons 2 1/2lb or about 1kg lean pork, cubed 1 clove garlic 4 level teaspoons medium curry powder (according to taste) 2oz/50g raisins 2oz/50g plain flour 1/2oz/10g brown sugar 1 onion peeled and chopped salt & pepper 4 tablespoons oil 2 bay leaves

Method

- · Soak apricots in cider overnight.
- Fry pork in oil until well browned. Lift out of pan and place in large casserole.
- Fry onion until brown. Sprinkle in curry powder and flour and cook for 1 minute, Add apricots, cider and stock. Bring slowly to boil and simmer until thick.
- Add other ingredients and pour over pork. Cover and cook
- 325F, 170C, Gas 3, for about 2 hours until tender

This recipe was first published in 'Smashing Grub' which was a recipe book compiled by members of SMASH, a women's group at St Mary's Nantwich. The proceeds went to the local organization for research into metabolic diseases. This organization is now called CLIMB. Thanks go to Angela Pugh who submitted the recipe (many!) years ago. I still use it - it's delicious!

Angela wrote that she used this recipe again at New Year as it's always popular. She got it from a magazine called Home & Freezer Digest - about 40 years ago!


Then part of a morning is spent proof reading all the contributions.


