
# St David's Wettenhall & St Oswald's Worleston March 2022

#### Dear Friends





I've just returned from the optician having had new lenses fitted in my glasses. Having decidedly fragile sight in one eye, the optician recommended I have transition lenses, which automatically go darker as the light becomes brighter to best protect my eyes. I've had transition lenses for a long time now, but it still set me thinking about other transitions, especially as I took a minute to admire crocuses, primroses and daffodils budding in Acton churchyard this morning as winter begins to transition to spring.

As March begins, we enter the period of the Church year which we call 'Lent'. It is a time of preparation, but it is also a time of transition. Most obviously, starting between early February and mid-March, depending on the date of Easter, and lasting for 6 weeks, Lent is frequently a transition from the cold, dull days of winter to warmer, more colourful days of spring.

Lent is also the period in the Church year where we transition from Christmas and Epiphany, seasons in which we focus on the birth, early life and early ministry of Jesus and turn towards Jesus' crucifixion on Good Friday and his resurrection on Easter Day and begin to look forward to Jesus' ascension into heaven, and the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

Lent can also be a time of transition in other ways. We might take up a 'Lenten Discipline' beginning on Ash Wednesday (2 March, this year) and ending on Easter Day. That might be a decision to give up a luxury such as chocolate or alcohol and to give the money which would have been spent on those items to charity. It might be a decision to take up some kind of exercise, such as walking for 30 minutes a day. Either of these things will help us to mature as people, and transition to a better version of ourselves. It might be a spiritual discipline, such as exploring different ways of praying, or reading a book of the bible, such as the Psalms, or one of the Gospels, so that we get to know a small part of God's word well, and it helps us to mature in our Christian life.

Lent can be seen as a sombre period of reflection and abstinence, but it can also be a time of transition, change and the slow beginning of something new.

Yours in the God who journeys with us in all the transitions and changes of life,

## St David of Wales and Wettenhall

The Church at Wettenhall is St. David's, but who was this man, more usually associated with Wales than Cheshire? David, known as Dewi in Wales, was born around 500 BC into a distinguished family, his grandfather the King of Ceredigion and his mother Saint Non. His death was recorded as 1st. March 589 AD.

David's family were known throughout Wales, Cornwall and Brittany, where he preached and built monasteries throughout his life. His best known monastery was built at Glyn Rhosyn in

Pembrokeshire. which later became known as St. Davids cathedral and town. Around 550 AD he went to the Synod of Brefi and his inspiring teaching resulted in him being elected as the Primate of the region. It was here

that his best known miracle is said to have occurred, when a small hill rose under his feet to enable the crowd to see and hear him. A white dove settled on his shoulder, his symbol since that time. You can see his doves, set in the form of a cross, in the stained-glass window at St. David's in Wettenhall. Where the miraculous hill rose up the village of Llanddewi Brefin can be visited today.

He was said to have visited the Abbey at Glastonbury to rededicate the altar and to donate a large sapphire. He commissioned an extension to the abbey, a detail verified in 1921. When Henry VIII closed the monasteries and confiscated their riches 1000 years later, a document records the removal of a sapphire altar from Glastonbury.

It was a hard life for followers of St. David. Monks had to plough fields by pulling the ploughs themselves. Eating meat was discouraged, the diet was mainly bread and water, and David is now the Saint of vegetarianism! His plant symbols are the leek and daffodil, so common in Wales, and the daffodils flowering around the time of his death.

He died after preaching that his followers should do 'the little things in life that you have

> seen me do' This phrase is now well known in the Welsh language. He St. David's, a popular shrine. However, in the 10th and

was buried at and it became 11<sup>th</sup> centuries it was raided by Vikings and the precious metal

removed. In 1275 it was rebuilt, and the base can still be seen today. Its jewelled canopy was confiscated by the Crown in the Reformation and the relics of David removed. His legend lives on as the Patron Saint of Wales, and in Wettenhall. On the Sunday nearest to 1st March we celebrate his life at St. David's with the church decorated with daffodils, leeks and dressed Welsh dolls. As usual there are always refreshments for all the congregation and visitors. We are doing the little things that he believed to be so special.



## Recipe

## Roast Topside of Beef with Mustard & Thyme Crust

## **Ingredients**

- 1kg topside of beef, boned & rolled
- A handful of thyme, leaves only
- 1 tbsp Dijon mustard
- 2 tbsp horseradish sauce
- 50g breadcrumbs
- 2 tbsp olive oil
- Sea salt
- Freshly ground pepper

#### Method

- 1. Heat your oven to 220°C/200°C/Gas 7. Unwrap your beef. Pat dry with kitchen paper and let it get up to room temperature.
- 2. While the beef warms up, make the crust. In a bowl combine the thyme, Dijon mustard and horseradish sauce. Tip in the breadcrumbs.
- 3. Add 2 tbsp oil to the bowl with a good pinch of salt and pepper. Stir together to make a sticky paste. Rub the mustardy mixture all over the beef and place in a roasting tin.
- 4. Put the tin into the centre of the oven. Turn the heat down to 180°C/Fan 160°C/Gas 4. Roast for 45 mins for rare, 1 hr for medium and 1 hr 15 mins for well done.
- 5. Take the beef out of the oven and set it aside on a plate or board, loosely covered with foil, to rest for 30 mins before carving.
