# St David's Wettenhall & St Oswald's Worleston May 2022

A popular tradition among young women on May Day was to rise with the dawn, wash their face with the dew, to ensure a fair complexion!! If you did, it seems that you would marry the first man you met afterwards! This was among a long list of things which are said to have gone on to celebrate May 1st, or May Day. I read that 'It was the time set aside for celebrating the first signs of summer. The people of England gathered on their village greens for May Day revels and to dance round the Maypole. The girls would dance and the prettiest of them would be chosen as May Queen.'

Perhaps some of this is fanciful and presents a sentimentalised view of the countryside, and I wondered as I read it how many people in our parishes remember such celebrations. I have seen maypoles and maypole dancing but it was not particularly connected with May Day.

I wondered too how relevant any of this can be in 2022. I am writing this in the first week of April when a cruel, unjust war rages in Ukraine, we are struggling out of a pandemic, and the cost of living has risen dramatically so that many families say that they will have to choose to 'eat or heat.' What else then can we find that is celebrated this May, apart from May Day?

This year, Ascension Day comes at the end of May - on Thursday 26th. It was then that Jesus ended his time with his friends and followers after his resurrection. He could not stay with them for good so he gave them his farewell instructions. He had told them about the Kingdom of God and their part in spreading the good news about it, and he said that they must wait in Jerusalem. Then he took them to the Mount of Olives near Jerusalem and assured them that his Spirit would be with them soon. As they listened a cloud hid Jesus from their sight. They returned to Jerusalem and waited and we know that later they did indeed receive the Holy Spirit and they began to spread the good news of Jesus and his kingdom of love and salvation. It spread throughout the world. Disciples of Jesus are still telling people the good news today.

God's presence is with us too, as it was with the first disciples. He can give us strength and hope and love. We just need to ask him. That is worth celebrating and holding on to however pessimistic we feel about the world today.

#### St Mary and the Visitation

On 31st May the feast day to commemorate the visitation of St. Mary, the mother of Jesus, to her cousin Elizabeth, is celebrated in Catholic and Anglican churches. Mary had been visited by an angel, who informed her that she was to be the mother of the son of God, and she was also told that her elderly cousin Elizabeth was expecting a child, despite her age. Elizabeth's husband Zachary was the child's father and God had a role in this rather unexpected event. Elizabeth's son was to be John the Baptist and would play his own part in Jesus's life when Jesus started his ministry in adulthood. The visit of the angel to Mary is called the Annunciation, and when it had taken place Mary had immediately left Nazareth and travelled to see her cousin. Zachary and Elizabeth are thought to have been living in Ein Karim, the mountain village southwest of the old city of Jerusalem.



When Mary reached the village, she found out that Elizabeth was six months pregnant. On meeting the two women both recognised that their pregnancies were uniquely special, and Elizabeth exclaimed that her unborn child already recognised that Mary was carrying the Son of God. In response to this news Mary is said to have sung the Magnificat in joy at their situation. The Magnificat begins with the words 'My Soul doth magnify the Lord' It is Mary's stated joy and honour that she has been chosen to be the Mother of the Son of God. Mary is thought to have remained with Elizabeth until John was born.

Ein Karim was identified as the place of the Visitation by Helena of Constantinople in Byzantine times. She built a church in the village and also identified a wellhead where Elizabeth and her son had drunk the water and a rocky area where Zachary and his family had hidden to avoid the slaughter of the first-born sons after the birth of Jesus. During the Crusades this first church, now in ruins, was built over by another two-storey church, and another church built over the wellhead. These became known as the Church of the Visitation and the Church of John the Baptist. A 12th century hall adjacent to the Church of the Visitation still stands and is remarkably well preserved. However, by 1480 most of the original buildings were in ruins and it was eventually purchased by The Franciscan Custody of the Holy Land in 1679. They appear to have left it untouched until 1862 when the current building was constructed, and the ruins restored. The courtyard now has a statue depicting the meeting of Mary and Elizabeth and 42 tablets on the walls carrying the words of the Magnificat in many languages, still a place of pilgrimage today.








## Highly Commended

#### Recipe

#### **Pineapple Pudding**

Our thanks are due to Diane Darlington who sent this. It was one of her gran's favourite recipes

#### Ingredients

- 1 pint/570ml milk
- 1 large tin pineapple.
- 4oz/110g butter
- 4 egg yolks
- 4oz/110 g plain flour
- 4oz/110 sugar

#### Method

- \* Put butter, sugar and milk into saucepan and melt slowly.
- \* In a bowl mix flour and juice of pineapple.
- \* Bring butter mixture to boiling point. Stir in flour and juice mixture. Boil gently stirring all the time until flour is cooked. Bring off boil.
- · Cut pineapple into small chunks
- \* Beat 4 egg yolks. Pour into pan mixture. Add Pineapple Chunks Stir well. Do not allow to boil again.
- \* Pour into serving dish. Leave overnight in fridge. Delicious cold next day.


