#### A Life of Faith and Service

We are all aware that, at the beginning of this month, we will celebrate a unique event in history. In fact, a unique event that has already taken place, almost without note. On 6 February this year, Queen Elizabeth II became the first monarch in England to reign for 70 years. It has never happened before, and it is impossible for it to happen again for many years to come. Over the weekend of the 69th anniversary of the Queen's coronation, the remarkable achievement of a Platinum Jubilee will be celebrated in many different ways across the country.

The defining mark of the Queen's reign is her commitment to service. So much so that, among the activities to mark the Platinum Jubilee is a scheme to involve communities in 70 acts of service. It is a commitment which has been inspired by the Queen's personal Christian faith. A faith rooted in Jesus, the Servant King.

As we remember each year in the week before Easter, Jesus is a King who takes off his outer garment, kneels at the feet of his followers and washes their feet. Jesus is a King whose throne is a cross and who wears a crown of thorns.

#### Easter at St David's

Easter began at St. David's with the Cross Country Parishes Maundy Thursday evening service and meal. People from across the Parishes came together to think about the Easter events for Jesus, his family and followers while enjoying the fellowship of a meal and conversation. John Major [Minshulls Nursery Butchery] provided a selection of hot meats, rolls and dressings, while those attending provided gorgeous desserts, cheese and fruit boards. It was the first Maundy Thursday meal since 2019 and everyone was relieved and delighted that we could hold this traditional meal again.

We commemorated the events of Good Friday differently this year. Each of the churches had a short outdoor service in recognition of the journey taken by Jesus when he was crucified. We were reminded of how he was beaten and forced to carry the heavy cross before being crucified. There were periods of reflection and prayer to remember his sacrifice on both Good Friday and Saturday.

On Easter Sunday St. David's church was once more transformed with daffodils and flower displays, decorative eggs and other Spring decorations to celebrate the Risen Lord. #### What is Eco-Church?

There can't be very many people who haven't heard or seen "eco" before another word – eco-friendly is a term seen everywhere from food products to the packaging it comes in, to fabrics for clothes, as a term, it's everywhere. So what is "Eco Church"?

The General Synod made a decision recently that the Church of England's churches and buildings would be carbon – neutral by 2030. This has created a serious debate of what that means, so making our church buildings work in harmony with the environment around it. Chester Diocese has signed up to become an Eco-Diocese and asks us all to think carefully about our environment in our parish communities. St David's PCC have discussed the idea of looking at how we might become an Eco Church, working together with our environment, our community and within our own church and churchyard.

The charity A Rocha, working with the Church of England Christian Aid, Methodist Church, Tearfund, United Reformed Church, and Allchurches Trust, (Ecclesiastical Insurance) has developed an Eco Church Award. There are three levels, Bronze, Silver and Gold. The awards have a questionnaire which assesses how eco- friendly our church buildings and our church life is, to minimise the impact on our environment. It encourages each church family to bring in a focus on our community, our understanding of Christian prayer and

teaching about Creation and our relationship with the land, sky, not forgetting those who work the land too. As a rural parish, all our lives are shaped by a relationship with the world around us – just look at our recent Easter photo competition for evidence of that.

The Eco Church Award encourages us to see where we are on a journey to live in balance with our world. Here are a few ideas:

- Audit our building to see if we can reduce our energy costs
- Make our outside spaces more inviting for humans and all creatures
- See if we are recycling efficiently
- Developing children's and young people's work focusing on the environment
- Linking with our local schools on shared projects
- Putting an understanding of God's Creation at the heart of our worship and prayer
- How we can understand and support those who make their living on the land

It could be exciting – creating spiritual spaces to sit in our church grounds, running a series of special services or discussions on environmental issues. It could be practical, linking with local groups, local councils, local schools. We might even twin with another parish on the other side of the world to see what they are doing.

We are a rural church, where we are aware every day of the beauty of the world around us. If you would like to be a part of the Eco Church Project, then contact the churchwardens at St David's for more details.

#### St Peter and The Keys

We are currently in the time of Ascension, 40 days after Jesus is crucified, when he ascends into Heaven. and this is followed by Pentecost 10 days later [5th June]. This time marks the start of the church widening out from the original followers of Jesus and moving into the community and those who had never actually seen Jesus for themselves. St. Peter had been called the Rock by Jesus, and Jesus had also told him that he would carry the keys to the gates of Heaven after Jesus' death. At Pentecost the people who had heard the sound and seen the flames of the Holy Spirit began speaking in different languages. Not surprisingly the crowds

who gathered said that they were drunk. Peter stood up and said that they were not drunk, but had received the Holy Spirit, and that anyone who believed in Jesus' resurrection and was prepared to be baptised could be part of the new church. For years after this Peter, and the other disciples, travelled around the Mediterranean countries preaching about Jesus and establishing churches. Peter is said to have gone to Antioch and then onto Corinth in Greece. He is then said to have travelled to Rome in Italy, along with Paul. The two men founded a church and Peter became its Bishop. There is little Biblical evidence of this, but Pope Clement I, writing in the first century AD records details of Peter's time in Rome. The Great





Nero was its ruler. He wished to blame the catastrophic fire on the Christian community and had Bishop Peter arrested. Peter was crucified in Nero's gardens, alongside Paul, and his body buried on the site which was to become St. Peter's Basilica. In the 4<sup>th</sup> Century Emperor Constantine I, built the first basilica over the site that was well known throughout the Christian community in Rome. The current St. Peter's Basilica was started by Pope Julius II in 1506 and completed in 1615, replacing the Old Basilica which had fallen into ruin.

St. Peter's Keys to Heaven have remained a central part of the Vatican City, Papal robes and documents and the Roman Catholic Faith. Images of him are usually shown carrying the keys, and

the keys appear on the flag of the Vatican City. In the 1960's male bones were excavated from beneath the Basilica and were eventually dated to the First Century AD. It was 1968 when Pope Paul VI announced that the bones were those of St. Peter. The majority of those remains were reburied beneath the High Altar of St. Peter's Basilica and it remains an awe-inspiring place for the millions of people, of all faiths, who visit each year.

#### Tribute to Queen Elizabeth II

'I declare before you all that my whole life, whether it be long or short, shall be devoted to your service'

Never has a promise been so admirably fulfilled. On February 6th this year, Her Majesty the Queen became the first British Monarch to reign for 70 years.

Like the Old Testament King David, the young Elizabeth was the unlikely child who became a monarch . Until the abdication of her uncle, she was not destined for monarchy and did not seek it. In spite of this, she has served the nation and the Commonwealth with a dedication and sense of duty that is unquestionable.

Historic footage of the Coronation provides an insight into the role this young woman was taking on. She swore an oath to uphold the Law and the Church. She was presented with a King James Bible, which is often said to be the most valuable gift she would ever be given - even though the Crown Jewels include the world's most valuable gem stones.

She received spurs representing chivalry, the Sword of State, some of the Crown Jewels, a ring symbolising her union with the nation, and two sceptres- one with a cross and the second with a dove representing the Holy Spirit- the Helper who inspires and encourages in all our lives, thankfully not just royalty - and whose day we also celebrate this year on June 5th, the Feast of Pentecost.

Under the privacy of a canopy there was the age-old tradition of anointing, going back to Biblical time itself.

Elizabeth was also presented with the Orb of State and told: 'Receive this Orb set under the Cross, and remember that the whole world is subject to the power and empire of Christ our Redeemer'. In recent years, the Queen has been ever more explicit in her Christmas Day broadcasts- about her belief in God, and her commitment to the Christian faith. She understands the true meaning of Service as she has followed in the footsteps of our Lord Jesus Christ - the original Servant King . We give thanks to God for her strong faith, her long life, and her sense of duty and service over the past 70 years.

May God bless her and all of us, as we celebrate this Platinum Jubilee.

#### Recipe

#### **Queen of Puddings**

#### **Ingredients**

- 4 Eggs
- 1 Pint Milk
- 4oz Breadcrumbs
- 3-4 tbsp Raspberry Jam
- 3oz Caster Sugar



#### Method

- \* Separate 3 eggs & beat together the 3 egg yolks & 1 whole egg.
- \* Add to the milk & mix well. Add the breadcrumbs.
- \* Put the jam on the base of a pie dish making 1/2inch layer.
- \* Pour over the milk, egg & crumb mixture. Leave to stand for 30mins.
- \* Bake at 150C /300F for 1 hour until set.
- \* Whisk the egg whites until stiff & fold in the sugar.
- \* Pile on top of the custard, sprinkle with a little sugar.
- \* Return to the cool oven for a further 15-20 mins until the meringue is set & slightly browned.


