St. Medardus; Patron Saint of Rain

If you have spent the last few weeks looking at the blue skies and hoping for rain, perhaps it is time to ask for a favour from Saint

Medardus, the Patron Saint of rain, weather in general, and those people who work outdoors. He was born in Salency in Picardy in 456 AD, just at the time of the fall of the Western Roman Empire and the reign of it's next Ruler, King Clovis, who brought together several smaller states to form Francia.

Eventually this huge area was to become modern France and Germany.

Northern Franger Germany.



At the age of 33 Medardus was consecrated and became the Bishop of Vermand in 530 AD. Within a year he had moved the seat of his Bishopric to Noyon because it had much

better defences than Vermand. A myth records that his brother, Saint Gildard, was the Bishop of Rouen and that they were born, consecrated and died on the same days of their lives. It was said that, as a child, Medardus was protected from rain by an eagle who hovered over him in a storm. He is often depicted with an eagle above him. This legend became the source of his role as the Patron Saint of rain and of those who work outside in all weathers. His Saint's Day is 8th June and the weather on that day is

said to last for 40 days, a situation shared by St. Swithun. He died in Noyon 545 AD and King Clotaire moved his casket to Croviacum [now Crouy] where a Benedictine abbey was built in his honour, the Abbey of St. Medard. He has always been venerated across

Northern France, Cologne and Western Germany.

Every year in Salency a local Rosiere, a virtuous young girl, is selected to be clothed in a long white dress, accompanied by 12 girls and 12 boys dressed in white and to attend a Mass with two godmothers. After vespers the Rosiere is crowned with 12 roses and



decorated with a blue ribbon and silver ring at the chapel of St. Medard. She receives a bouquet of roses from the local mayor, along with two arrows, two tennis balls and a whistle. After blowing the whistle three times and throwing nuts to the crowds she processes to a fair where everyone enjoys rides, stalls and fireworks. Sounds like a great village fete, and could help us all with filling those reservoirs.



Milford House Farm National Garden Scheme Open Garden July 23rd

After the hottest week the UK has ever experienced, we woke up to a cool and drizzly day for the open garden this year. It was a disappointing start to the proceedings, but once people started to arrive it made all the preparation worth while once more. As ever the community had been overwhelmingly generous with donations of cakes, scones and all sorts of sweet treats for peckish garden visitors. This year the Cream Tea Society kindly donated Roddas clotted cream and Tiptree strawberry jam to go with those homemade scones, an extra treat! The hot dry weather had played havoc with gardening plans [and farming plans too!!) but the banana plant has loved the heat and has leaves about a metre long. Keeping the plants for sale watered kept me on my toes every day but added almost £300 to our kitty. The garden open and private groups together gave us a fantastic total of £1960.00. Of this sum £200 was donated to the Cheshire branch of the MS society. £300 to Melanoma UK and £1460 to the National Garden Scheme for its health and nursing related charities. Thank you all for your brilliant assistance in raising this money for such worthwhile causes. Whether it was visiting and eating, carpark attending, cleaning, taking the entrance and tea tent monies, baking, potting up plants for sale or helping to put up, and take down, the marquee, dog sitting and a thousand other jobs, a huge **THANK YOU**.

Louise Farrenc demanded equal pay in 1850 and GOT IT!!

THE PROFESSIONAL group, recently re-named Cheshire Virtuosi, consists of professors and alumni of the Royal Northern College of Music will be performing rarely heard live nonets. Louise Farrenc, born in 1804, was the only female teacher at the Paris Conservatoire in the whole of the 19th century. Her *Nonet*, completed in 1849, brought her so much acclaim that she was able to demand equal pay in line with her male colleagues and, amazingly for the time, got it! You will now have the opportunity to experience this delightful piece live, along with an exciting

rarely performed nonet by the brilliant film composer, **Nino Rota** (*The Godfather*). As an extra treat we will feature endangered instruments bassoon and bass in a comic duo by the French 20th century composer, **Albert Roussel**. Finally, you will hear a **world premiere** of *Tears of a Clown*, by horn player, **Peter Richards**, based on the 1970's number one hit '*Tears of a Clown'* by Smokey

Robinson and the Miracles, which features a bassoon solo and woodwind. Incidentally, many pop songs from the 1970's feature bassoon, woodwind, and strings, including "Puppet on a string" by Sandie Shaw, "Laughing Gnome" by Davie Bowie and numerous Beatles hits too.

Recipe

Super Healthy Italian Meat Balls With Chunky Tomato Sauce

Ingredients

- 500g Lean Ash House Minced Beef
- 1 small onion finely chopped
- 1 medium carrot, peeled & finely grated
- 2 cloves of garlic peeled & crushed
- 1 tsp dried oregano
- ½ tsp fine sea salt
- 1 tsp sunflower oil
- Freshly ground black pepper

Tomato Sauce

- 2 tsp sunflower oil
- 1 small onion finely chopped
- 1 clove of garlic peeled & crushed
- 400g of tinned tomatoes, chopped
- 100ml of red wine
- 200ml of cold water

Method

- To make the meat balls, mix the mince, onion, carrot, garlic, oregano, salt & lots of black pepper, in a bowl with clean hands. Then with wet hands form into balls, similar size to a whole walnut.
- Pour the oil into a large non-stick frying pan and fry the meat balls over a medium heat, turning regularly until lightly browned. This should take around 5 minutes. Then set aside on a plate.
- To make the sauce, pour the oil into the same pan with remaining juices, add the onion and saute for 4 -5 minutes. Then add the garlic for a further 1 minute more. Add the tomatoes, red wine & water to the pan and simmer gently for 5 minutes stirring regularly. Return the meat balls to the pan & bring back to simmer.
- Cover the Pan loosely and leave to simmer for around 20 minutes, stirring occasionally. After 20 minutes remove the lid and continue to simmer for a further 20 minutes or until the sauce thickens. Continue to stir often and add extra water / wine if the sauce reduces too quickly
- Serve hot with pasta or freshly cooked seasonal vegetables. Or to be less healthy include some crusty buttered bread with the pasta and veg.
