The Harvest of our Lives

We were all saddened when we heard of the death of Her Late Majesty, Queen Elizabeth. An astonishing 90% of the population have never known life without Queen Elizabeth II on the throne. The remaining 10% will have been 70 years younger than they are now when King George VI was on the throne. As the news broke, and in the days to follow, many stories were told, personal as well as official, of the encounters The Queen had had with the 31% of the population.

It was a time of reflection and remembering. A time to give thanks for a long life well lived. A time to assess the astonishing impact of The Queen's reign. It was, in a sense, a time to appreciate and assess the harvest of a much-loved Queen.

We are quite used, especially in this area, to assessing the Harvest. Has it been a good year with warmth, sunshine and rain in the right amounts and the right order? Too little water and the grain (fruit and vegetables) don't swell, and some grow wonky. Too much water and the crops rot in the ground. It is obvious to assess in the size and quality of the yield. It should be an obvious comparison, but how often do we think of our lives as a field to be harvested?

Are we receiving the right amount of encouragement, love, wholesome inputs of information from the internet, books and the company? Are we producing good quality fruit which benefits the world in which we live and makes life better for those around us?

The life of Her Late Majesty Queen Elizabeth has born a rich harvest. She has improved the lives of those she met and of her citizens both in the United Kingdom and the Commonwealth immeasurably. The secret of that harvest, as she has not been shy of telling us in recent years, has been her deeply rooted faith in Jesus Christ. The fruit of The Queen's life has grown in the soil of bible reading, prayer and obedience to Jesus Christ.

As we continue to reflect on the life of Queen Elizabeth II, we can use the opportunity to look at our own lives and ask what we can do to improve the quality of the harvest of our own lives.

Saint Francis of Assisi

On 4th October it is the feast day of St. Francis of Assisi, one of the most well known of all saints. He is the Patron Saint of Italy, along with St Catherine of Siena. He was born in 1181, named Giovanni, but known as Francesco to his family. It was a wealthy family, and he lived the typical life of a wealthy young man, but beneath this was a concern for poorer people. In 1202 he was involved in a military expedition, imprisoned and became ill. On release from prison, he left behind his former life to 'marry' Lady Poverty. Following a vision of Christ asking him to repair My Church he lived as a beggar rebuilding ruined chapels, including St. Mary of the Angels near Assisi.



In 1208 he started preaching and established a new religious order with 11 followers. This was the Franciscan Order. Soon a local noblewoman, Clare of Assisi, joined the followers and established her own order of The Poor Clares. A third order, now known as the Secular Franciscan Order, was created for lay people. Taking his beliefs to the wider world Francis travelled to Egypt during the Fifth Crusade to try to convert the Sultan to Christianity. Although that was not achieved the Sultan allowed him to travel to Jerusalem and other Holy sites. From 1217 Franciscans have been in Christian sacred sites and are known as the Custodians of the Holy Land for the Catholic Church.

Francis is best known for his love of the natural World and praised the Sun, Moon, Water, Wind, Earth and Fire. He is often pictured with a bird following the legend that he preached to trees full of birds. In 1220 he celebrated Christmas with the first Nativity scene created from a straw filled manger with a real donkey and ox standing beside it. Today this love of animals is celebrated by the blessing of pets in church on his feast day of 4th October. A further honour was the creation of Francis as the Patron Saint of Ecology on 29th November 1979 by Pope John Paul II.



In September 1224 Francis was praying when he received the stigmata – the mark of Christ's wounds on the Cross. He became ill and did not respond to treatment, eventually dying on the evening of 3rd October 1226. On 16th July 1228 he was declared a Saint and the Basilica of St. Francis built for his remains. Lost for centuries, his remains were identified in the 1818 and in 1978 they were confirmed and placed in a glass urn in the original tomb. He continues to be relevant to modern times, environmental issues being at the forefront of our concerns across the world.

We could make ourselves out on a few of these so we purchased them. On the photo here you can just see the top of my navy-blue hat. That was the moment when she gave me the purses. She didn't speak - just smiled and I managed a 'Thank you, your Majesty'

That's what we all want to say just now.

It is hard to believe that just 3 short months ago we were celebrating the Queen's Platinum Jubilee and now she has passed. While we mourn her passing we must also remember to celebrate her life, a life dedicated to the service of her subjects following a promise she made at the tender age of 21, while still a Princess.

Released for the Jubilee were many hours of personal film footage which gave an insight to her life previously unseen and showed the fun loving and caring side of her character along with many anecdotes from various people who knew her well, highlighting her sense of humour and mischief.

We should be grateful that we have had her as our figurehead for the last 70 years, and also for the opportunity we had to express our love and thanks to her for all that she has done for the nation, the commonwealth and beyond, during the Jubilee celebrations. Recipe

Irish Teabread

Ingredients

- 1lb/450g mixed dried fruit
- 6oz/175g dark brown sugar
- 1/4 pint of strong dark tea
- 8oz/225g self raising flour
- 2oz/50g walnuts chopped (optional)
- 1 egg beaten



Method

- Put the dried fruit and sugar in to a bowl and pour over the tea.
- · Cover the bowl and put aside over night.
- · Next day grease a 2lb/1kg loaf tin and line
- Sift the flour and stir in to the tea mixture with the walnuts, if used and beaten egg
- Put in to the prepared tin and bake in a moderately slow oven 325F/170C, Mark 3 for 1 and a 1 ¼ hours to 1 ½ hours or until well risen, golden and cooked when tested
- Turn out of the tin and cool on a wire rack
- Served sliced and buttered
