After a forest fire in Yellowstone National Park, forest rangers began their trek up a mountain to assess the inferno's damage. One ranger found a bird, literally petrified in ashes, perched statuesquely on the ground at the base of a tree. Somewhat sickened by the eerie sight, he knocked over the bird with a stick. When he gently struck it, three tiny chicks scurried from under their dead mother's wings. 

Holly Holy Day

St Mary's Church organised several events during the annual 'Holly Holy Day' on Saturday 21st January 2023. The events took place on the same day as The Sealed Knot Battle of Nantwich re-enactment in Nantwich.

The church was open from 9am and visitors were served hot drinks and buttered toast. A number of them enjoyed the opportunity to join guided tours up the church's tower to the ringing chamber.

Addressing an audience of approximately 130 people, local historian Mike Lea brought history to life - as he talked the audience through the key stages of the Civil War and the strategic importance of Nantwich in the outcome of the wider conflict. Nick & Caroline Harley and Nigel Anderson explained specifically how Acton Church was used during the siege before leading dozens of people on a guided walk to view the battlefields. The walkers were able to visualise where the opposing forces were positioned and gain a better understanding of the way the landscape influenced the battle and what happened at the different stages of the conflict. Everyone gained a fascinating insight into the role of Acton Church at the time of the battle of Nantwich. The event raised £128.70 towards church funds.

Churchyard Records

The records of the words on grave headstones in the churchyard are an important part of church family history. I have been working in the past months with Stephan Davies and Tracey Foster to update these records with a view to reprinting them. The Church recognised the importance of transcribing the so called "monumental inscriptions" in the late 1990s. The first survey of the churchyard was carried out by the Family History Society of South Cheshire. It was updated from time to time but the current paper records kept in the Vestry did not include any of the memorials since 2009, or the new extension area now in use. We are working to gather this information and add in any other corrections and new details.

The Church often receives enquiries from relatives searching for the resting place of a loved one. It is important that these are available so that the details can be traced and passed on. The lettering of headstones does not last forever, and reading the older ones can be a challenge. We have to admire the patience and diligence of the team who undertook the original survey. Letterings on stones are soon choked with moss or covered by lichen. Every winter sees the disappearance of some of the inscriptions in almost any churchyard.

The oldest headstone record on a grave is this:

F. 29. Upright headstone which is leaning against a bricked up doorway. In good condition but broken and with pieces missing. The edges are broken away.

ere lyeth inte / the body of RICHA / FILCOCK of CHOLMO / DESTON who died / July the $16\ 1671$

There are about 2700 headstones recorded in the churchyard, which also hosts a small number of the Commonwealth War Grave Commission graves. In additional there are many family graves who record a family member who is buried in a battlefield far away.

We are working toward a reprint on the documents in 2023, changing from one large volume to three smaller ones. If all goes well, we will digitise the finished documents and add them to the church web site pages. Rather than one large plan for the whole churchyard, there will be an overview for orientation, and then smaller convenient section views for the plot numbers and exact locations.

Part of the plan is to have the records in a form that can be readily updated and safeguarded. Tracey is going to do this.

I am a genealogist and know the value of parish records like these held by the church. With the virtual absence of burial registers and the relatively recent date of baptismal and marriage registers, gravestones are an often unique source of information for the seventeenth to early nineteenth centuries. It is a privilege to work with these records.

Flowers and artificial flowers, are allowed, but it is requested that they are removed when faded or become out of season. Please; no photos or lights.

Voting Regulations for Local Elections May 2023

Changes to Voting

Make Sure that You Can Vote on 4th May 2023

Voting regulations were changed last year in the Elections Act 2022. From now on make sure that you can vote in local and National elections by being registered to vote and having photographic identification [photo ID] if you are voting at a polling station.

Registering to Vote

You must register to vote before Monday 17th April 2023. This can be done online at: gov.uk/register-to-vote or telephone the electoral services team at 0300 123 5016.

Photo ID

If you are voting at a local polling station **you must have photo ID**. The acceptable forms include ;-

- UK, European Economic Area [EEA] or Commonwealth passport.
- UK or EEA photo driving licence [not Commonwealth driver's licence].
- Travel passes such as an older person's bus pass or an Oyster 60+ card.

If your photo ID has expired it can still be used if you are recognisable from the photograph.

If you have no photo ID you can apply for free online at gov.uk website or voteridentification@cheshireeast.gov.uk, or complete a paper form, or telephone the electoral services team on **0300 123 5016**

Voting By Post

You can vote by post and must apply before Tuesday 18th April. The form can be found at The Electoral Commission website or by phoning **0300 123 5016**.

Modern Martyrs

Modern Martyrs; Westminster Abbey

St. Maximilian Kolbe

One of the statues of Modern Martyrs above the west door at Westminster Abbey is that of St. Maximilian Kolbe, a Polish Christian who died in the Nazi concentration camp of Auschwitz – Birkenau alongside mainly Jewish prisoners. So how did he come to be a prisoner at Auschwitz, passing beneath those infamous gates to his death?

Maximilian was born on 8th January 1894 at Zdunska Wola to a devout Christian, nationalistic family. At age 18 he travelled to Rome to study philosophy and theology, becoming a founder member of the Militia Immaculatae with other fellow students in 1917. Their religious order existed for devotion to the Virgin Mary, to evangelise and to undertake good works. He returned to Poland to lecture at the Franciscan seminary at Krakow and was given land near Warsaw by Prince Jan Drucki - Lubecki in 1927. This land became Niepokalanow, the City of the Immaculata. The movement became famous throughout Poland for its influential publications, some of which did contain anti-semitic material, although not written by Maximilian.

In 1930 Kolbe moved to Nagasaki in Japan

to establish another base for the Immaculataes and to publish further journals. As the Polish journals became hugely successful he returned home to his 'modern workshop of the improvement of man'- his religious publications. When war broke out in Poland he sent the Brothers away, but remained himself. He was soon arrested and eventually interned in Auschwitz. He maintained his faith in the camp, hearing confessions, secretly celebrating mass and giving his food to fellow prisoners. In July 1941 a prisoner escaped from Auschwitz and fellow prisoners were selected for punishment. Franciszek Gajowniczek was condemned to death until Maximilian offered himself in exchange. Ten prisoners were placed in a starvation cell and within two weeks six had died. However, Maximilian remained fully conscious and was executed by lethal injection on the Eve of the Assumption of Mary, 14th August 1941.

His cell remains a shrine and he was beatified as Confessor by Pope Paul VI in 1970 and Canonised as a Martyr by Pope John Paul II in 1982. He was commemorated at Westminster Abbey on 13th January 2019 following the placing of his statue amongst those of the other Modern Martyrs.





Recipe

Simnel Cake

Mothering Sunday falls on the fourth Sunday of Lent. Back in the 1700s, the day was marked by young house servants returning home to spend time with their mothers. That custom evolved from an earlier one in which families who had moved away would return to the original church they attended. Today, the holiday remains grounded in religion, with many churches handing out daffodils for children to give to Mum. Traditionally, girls also bake a fruitcake for their mothers.

Ingredients

For the almond paste

- 250g/9oz caster sugar
- 250g/9oz ground almonds
- 2 free-range eggs, beaten
- 1 tsp almond essence
- •

For the cake

- 175g/6oz butter or margarine, plus extra for greasing
- 175g/6oz soft brown sugar
- 3 free-range eggs, beaten
- 175g/6oz plain flour
- pinch salt
- ½ tsp ground mixed spice (optional)
- 350g/12oz mixed raisins, currants and sultanas & peel
- ½ lemon, grated zest only
- 1–2 tbsp apricot jam
- 1 free-range egg, beaten for glazing

Method

- For the almond paste, place the sugar and ground almonds in a bowl. Add enough beaten egg and mix to a fairly soft consistency. Add the almond essence and knead for 1 minute until the paste is smooth and pliable. Roll out a third of the almond paste to make a circle 18cm/7in in diameter and reserve the remainder for the cake topping.
- 2. Preheat the oven to 140C/120C Fan/Gas 1. Grease and line a 18cm/7in cake tin.
- 3. For the cake, cream the butter and sugar together until pale and fluffy. Gradually beat in the eggs until well incorporated and then sift in the flour, salt and mixed spice (if using) a little at a time. Finally, add the mixed dried fruit, peel and grated lemon zest and stir into the mixture.
- 4. Put half the mixture into the cake tin. Smooth the top and cover with the circle of almond paste. Add the rest of the cake mixture and smooth the top leaving a slight dip in the centre to allow for the cake to rise. Bake in the preheated oven for 1¾ hours. Test by inserting a skewer in the middle – if it comes out clean, it is ready. Once baked, remove from the oven and set aside to cool on a wire rack.
- 5. Brush the top of the cooled cake with the apricot jam. Divide the remainder of the almond paste in half. Roll out a circle to cover the top of the cake with one half and form 11 small balls with the other half. Place the circle of paste on the jam glaze and set the balls round the edge. Brush the cake topping with a little beaten egg.
- Preheat the grill. Place the cake onto a baking tray and grill for 1–2 minutes, or until the top of the marzipan begins to brown. Alternatively, lightly heat the cake topping using a cook's blowtorch, until the marzipan is golden brown.
- 7. The eleven balls of almond paste represent Jesus' disciples minus Judas!
