### **Messy Church**

In May we "grew" a tree and learned that having "faith as small as a mustard tree can move mountains". Over the last few years there have been three Public Meetings about the future of Worleston Church. This culminated in a Public Consultation, during April and May this year, about a proposed amalgamation of the Parish of Acton with the Parish of Worleston.

No representations were made during the Public Consultation period, and the Church Commissioners were able to make the Pastoral Measure necessary to form the Parish of Acton with Worleston on 31 May 2023. This was subsequently signed into being by the Bishop of Chester, enabling the Parish to come into being on 1 June this year.



### Modern Martyrs: Saint Oscar Romero

Saint Oscar Romero; Modern Martyrs The statues above the West door of Westminster Abbey represent modern Christian martyrs from every continent. Saint Oscar Romero was born, and died. in El Salvador in South America. He was born in Ciudad Barrios, a mountainous area east of El Salvador, the second child of seven siblings on 15th August 1917. By the time he was 13 he had already decided to enter the Catholic priesthood and attended a seminary in San Miguel. He moved to the capital city, San Salvador, and then was ordained in Rome in 1942. In January 1944 he returned to San Miguel and became the secretary of the diocese, spending 23 years in this role.

Romero became known as a popular and inspirational preacher, reaching people in new organisations and via radio stations across San Miguel. He was broadly a supporter of the new Catholic church outlined in the document of Vatican II. In 1970 he was made the auxiliary Bishop of San Salvador and was known as a rather conservative administrator with religious and temperamental views to match. However, in 1974 he became the Bishop of Santiago de Maria, and then archbishop of San Salvador in February 1977. That month, people protesting in the capital were attacked by soldiers and in March a radical priest, Rutilio Grande, who was known to Romero, was murdered in Aguilares. The lack of any enquiry or prosecutions resulted in Romero realising that power had moved to the soldiers and death squads operating throughout the country. Those with power and wealth were protected by the military and a fraudulent election process created a new government, leading to talk of a revolution.

Romero dedicated himself to the poor and defenceless and became the centre of

a radical moral group. Human rights abuses were documented and truth broadcast against a background of official lies. People started to 'disappear' and press attacks were made against Romero for his views, despite the fact that he insisted that his church was not a political movement. Several priests were murdered and Romero met the Pope in Rome with documented evidence of injustice in El Salvador. This approach led him to become more isolated both inside and outside the church. Danger was increasing and Romero said, 'I must tell you, as a Christian, I do not believe in death without resurrection. If I am killed. I shall arise in the Salvadoran people'. Yet on 24th March 1980 he was shot while celebrating Mass in the hospital where he lived. His life was over, but now he is celebrated and revered by people all over El Salvador. He was beatified by Pope Francis on 23<sup>rd</sup> May 2015 and became a Saint in Rome on 14th October 2018. A special Evensong of the canonisation of St. Oscar Romero took place in Westminster Abbey on 17th November 2018.



### Recipe

### **Summer Strawberry Posset**

### Serves 2 Ingredients

- 2 tbsp sparkling white grape juice (or Prosecco!)
- 100 ml low-fat creme fraiche
- 2 tbsp caster sugar
- To Crumbled shortbread biscuit for decoration



#### Method

- Set aside a couple of strawberries for decoration and blitz the remainder with grape juice or Prosecco.
- Heat the cream and sugar in a saucepan over a medium heat until just bubbling, then simmer for 2 minutes...
- Stir in the pureed strawberries and simmer for a further minute.
- Remove from the heat and stir in the creme fraiche and lime zest.
- Allow to cool before dividing into 2 ramekins and chill for 3 hours or overnight.
- Before serving, decorate with remaining strawberries and sprinkle over crumbled shortbread.
