Dear Friends

One step at a time...



By the time you read this we will be celebrating the great Christian festival of Easter. Our Alleluias will be filling the church, not just on Easter Day, but for 50 days afterwards when we arrive at the feast of Pentecost. Although it is no more important than the other 9 principal Holy Days in the Church calendar, Easter feels particularly special, as spring erupts in all its glory and the promise of new life can be seen all around. It is as if all creation joins our celebrations.

Our very familiarity with the resurrection, and the knowledge that it will follow the crucifixion, sometimes blinds us to the reality of the first Easter, when disbelief, confusion and joy kept close company.

Despite Jesus' careful teaching and preparation, the disciples weren't expecting him to rise from the dead. Instead of unfettered joy, the first Easter was a series of stumbling steps and joyous discovery.

Mark's Gospel ends with the disciples fleeing in terror when they find the tomb empty. Seeing him through her tears, Mary Magdelene mistakes the risen Jesus for the gardener before she recognises his voice. She joyously runs to tell the disciples, only to find they don't believe her. Thomas wasn't present when Jesus appeared to the disciples the first Easter evening, and refused to believe that Jesus was alive until he saw Jesus for himself a week later. Despite a lengthy Bible study on the road to Emmaus, it isn't until Jesus breaks bread that Cleopas and his companion recognise Jesus. Step by step, the disciples began to understand and rejoice in the resurrection and continue to discover what it meant for them one step at a time through the rest of the New Testament.

We are an Easter People, and Alleluia is our song. It is right that we celebrate the resurrection with all the joy and energy we can muster. We are also disciples of Jesus. What the resurrection means, even as we sing our Alleluias, will only make sense as we walk with Jesus' first disciples one step at a time: walking in the company of Jesus through the rest of our lives.

Condolences

It is sad to record the passing of George Harding, husband to the late Nora. George aged 90, passed away last December but was laid to rest in early February following a lovely service in Crewe Crematorium Chapel. The delay was due to two of his sisters visiting their elder brother John who lives in Australia.

George and his family were brought up at The Old Vicarage, Gradeley Green and from a boy until after his retirement George sang in the choir at St Mary's Acton. George loved the countryside, and following in the footsteps of his father, was a keen gardener. The picture shows the daffodils he planted in Welshmans Lane an annual reminder of George Harding.



Acton and Reaseheath WI

At our February meeting we were treated to a fascinating talk from Graham Dodd, a volunteer at the Nantwich Museum, about the fires of Nantwich, including the Great Fire of 1583. Our town was plagued by fires from the 12th century through to the 20th century due to the construction of our buildings. Wood, wattle and daub, and thatch being flammable materials and as we cooked on open fires and lit our homes by candle these posed a constant threat of fire. The Great Fire in 1583 destroyed a large part of the town which was rebuilt by funds collected by Queen Elizabeth I and her Privy Council which raised £1000. This deed is marked by a plaque in Nantwich Square, now called "Queen's Aid House".

Graham also entertained us with stories about our local fire brigades and the rivalry between the two fire stations located next door to each other. Some of the equipment they used to put out the fires is on show at the Museum.

Confirmation

A Confirmation Service with Bishop Sam will take place at 11.00 am on Sunday 2 June (Trinity Sunday).

I am aware of a small group of young adults wishing to be Confirmed. If you have not been Confirmed and would like to think more about the possibility of joining them, please contact Rev Anne (countryvicar@outlook.com or 01270 628864).

A 6 week course looking at the Christian faith will be held after Easter, for anyone interested in Confirmation or in refreshing their understanding of the Christian faith.

If you have already been Confirmed but have recently come back to faith it is possible to renew your Baptism Vows as a way of publicly re-affirming your commitment to Christ. Adults who have not been Baptised and would like be Baptised are normally Baptised and Confirmed at the same service.

Participating in the course does not commit you to being Confirmed, although you will need to do the course if you wish to be Confirmed, Baptised or renew your Baptism Vows.



The Apostles; Saint John

John was the younger brother of James and was the son of Zebedee and Salome, making him a first cousin to Iesus. It is believed that he was one of the first Apostles to be called, alongside Andrew, when Jesus was named as 'The Lamb of God' by John the Baptist and the two of them became disciples immediately. With his brother he was known by Jesus as the 'sons of thunder' because of their loud vocal support of Him. John is thought to be the youngest of the Apostles, and the only one to live a long life and to die of natural causes rather than as a martyr. We all associate John with the Gospel of John, and there is a traditional belief that he was also the author of the three Epistles of John and the Book of Revelation. The Gospel of John is said to be written by the most beloved of the disciples, a term for John and his relationship with Jesus. John is said to be the man who sat next to Jesus at the supper when He was betrayed and then to be the only disciple present at the crucifixion when Jesus called to him to take care of Mary after His own death. The Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke concentrate mainly on the last year of Jesus's life. However, it appears that John's writings were written much later than the other Gospels, perhaps about 75-100 years after Jesus's death. Research into John's four documents has indicated that they are likely to have several anonymous authors and were written over an extended period of time, but there are differing views on this, and many believe that John was the true author of his Gospel.

There is no indication in the Bible of how many years the Apostles remained in Judea, but about 12 years after Jesus died the Roman, Herod Agrippa, came to power and increased the persecution of Christians. The disciples scattered

throughout the Roman Empire and John continued his preaching. He trained other followers such as Polycarp, who eventually became the Bishop of Smyrna and continued to expand the church with the teachings of Jesus. John continued to travel and reached Rome in his old age. There he was arrested by the Emperor Domitian, a Roman known for his persecution of Christians, John was condemned to death and sent to the colosseum, where he emerged uninjured from a vat of boiling oil. The audience in the arena, witnessing this miracle, were all converted to Christianity. He ended his life in Ephesus and his remains were said to be buried at the Basilica of St. John in Selcuk, a town close to Ephesus. His life is celebrated on 27th December and his saintly image is that of an old man with his tablets of writings and a chalice to represent his survival after drinking poison, another miraculous escape for the most beloved Apostle.

Recipe

Beef Short Ribs

Serves 4

Method

Ingredients

- 5 4 large or 8 small Ash House Beef Short Ribs

- ∑ 2 Onions, thickly sliced
- ∑ 2 Bay Leaves
- 1 Large thyme sprig
- ā 250ml Beer

Rub

- ☐ 1 tbsp garlic powder
- 1 tbsp mustard powder
- 1 tbsp ground ginger
- 1tbsp cocoa powder
- 2 tsp smoked paprika
- □ 1 tsp cayenne
- 1 tsp ground cumin
- 百 1 tsp salt
- 2 tbsp sunflower oil

- First make the rub. Put the spices into a bowl with the salt and oil. Mix thoroughly and coat the short ribs. Cover and leave them to marinate in the fridge for a few hours or overnight.
- Heat the olive oil in a large casserole dish and sear the ribs until well browned. Remove the ribs and add the butter. As soon as the butter has foamed, add the onions and sauté them until golden brown. Add the garlic and stir for another few minutes.
- Add the bay leaves, thyme, beer and ginger beer. Stir to make sure the base of the dish is deglazed and bring to the boil. Place the ribs into the casserole dish, cover and simmer the ribs over the lowest heat for 2 hours.
- Preheat a grill to a medium high heat / heat a griddle pan on the hob or prepare a barbecue. Brush the ribs liberally with the sauce and grill for a few minutes on both sides until lightly charred and heated through.
- Serve with more of the sauce.


